My name is Lily Gaetgaeow, and I am the Registration Coordinator for The Center for Irish Music (CIM). I will be representing CIM tomorrow at the Public Hearing for our Sound Level Variance Permit application.

Initially, I contacted Barb McMonigal-St. Dennis with additional questions about how to prepare for the Public Hearing (see email below). I followed up with her on the phone today. She directed me to the City Council's online meeting agenda and to view any public comments that have been submitted in advance, which was very helpful. For my questions about making changes to our permit request, she suggested I seek the City Council's advice for how to best proceed.

In our original application, we requested a sound level variance permit for amplified sound on two days (Friday, June 9 and Saturday, June 10). While we intend to hold the Great Session Experience on Friday as scheduled, we will <u>not</u> be using amplified sound that night. We only intend to use amplified sound for the Master Artists concert on Saturday, June 10. How do we withdraw our application for the June 9 sound level variance permit?

We are also concerned that with many guest artists added to our concert line-up, it is likely that the program will run just past 9:30 pm, and our audience will request an encore performance. How feasible is it to request an extension to turn off our sound equipment on Saturday at 10 or 10:30 pm, instead of 9:30 pm as indicated in section 4 of the letter?
