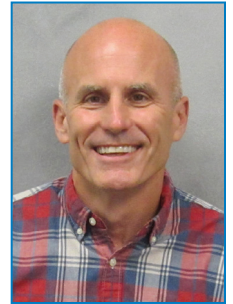
Jim Bode, Dave Wagner to retire
