Case Narrative

Saint Paul Police Department were called to investigate a possible break-in at a residence. SPPD officers (SPPD SQ#353) arrived and requested St Paul Fire Department's fire investigation unit with reports of an extinguished fire in the basement. House appears on the vacant / condemned list of addresses per PD. PD also reports that neighbors have made complaints that a couple and their child have been living in the basement of the residence. PD made contact with the owners daughter who reported that her parents who are the owners are out of town; that she stopped there today for the first time in approximately 7 days and discovered that the front window had been broken and that a side door had appeared to be forced. SPPD officers confirmed that the door on side bravo appeared forced and was slightly ajar upon their arrival. Firefighters arrived and began investigations and found evidence of a previous fire in the basement with smoke and soot damage to all three levels of the house and signs of significant heat on the first floor as indicated by melted ceiling fan blades. House and area of origin was monitored for VOCs and no traces were picked up. There was a double Halogen stand work light that was plugged in the immediate area that cannot be ruled out as a possible ignition source. There was a box of wood-stick matches near the area of origin as well. No other competent ignition sources noted throughout the investigation. Further investigation also showed signs of current renovation throughout the house. A pipe had also burst and ice could be seen on both the first floor interior and exterior on side bravo. There was a mattress located in the basement near the area of origin, however, no other indications of current occupancy noted. Firefighters concluded the investigation, contacted Xcel to secure utilities, submitted an Inspection Request form 4 and made contact with the owner's daughter. Command was terminated and the scene was released to SPPD whom provided security until the arrival of the daughter.

After examination of the fire scene, observation of fire patterns of both movement and intensity, as well as statements made by the owner's daughter to SPPD it is my opinion the area of origin was in the basement. The first fuel/material ignited was most likely ordinary combustible materials on the top of an ottoman-style piece of furniture. The ignition source was radiant heat from a halogen light. The oxidant was normal atmospheric air. The action that brought these items together was a halogen light being placed to close to ordinary combustible material. The classification of fire cause is accidental. This concludes my investigation and report.
