Staff compete in Hydrant Hysteria at MN AWWA in Duluth





New horizontal directional boring machine used on leads

The machine operator can track and guide the drilling head through the ground, resulting in more accuracy than a pneumatic bullet. It can be used to drill directly into a home, after which the copper piping is attached and pulled back to connect to the water main or copper service line.
