I wish for my comments to be entered into the public record '**anonymously**' since I have already been verbally harassed and threaten by one of the occupants of the property.

Comments:

I have lived in the neighborhood for more than 15 years. The 802 property has had a troubled past and the last 12 months it has only accelerated.

- there has been intermittent trash burnings, which are left unattended

- trash bags, household items (couches, big screen TV, washing machine, general junk) have lined the north exterior wall of the house and backyard for months on end. Last year it was not unusual to see a vehicle driven and parked in the backyard (alley side).

- dogs are tied out in the front of the property and until recently the side yard, were they snap and growl at pedestrians passing by. It's unnerving to have a dog lunge and race to the end of its chain coming full tilt at you. I actually feel bad for the animals, there seems to be a fast turn over of dogs.

- I have witnessed drug deals in and out of 802. People park a few houses down from 802, walk to the house and come out 10 minutes later then drive away. I have also seen an SUV pull up in front of the house, then a "house occupant" goes to the SUV, opens the back door of the vehicle, stuffs something in their bag then reenters the house.

DEA, ATF and the Saint Paul police have been called to this residence many times over the years.

- loud domestic issues are often ended by the police being called

- It is my understanding that no one is suppose to be occupying the house from 8PM-8AM. That has not been adhered to. There has been at least one person (a woman) who has continued to sleep there at night, burning candles inside. Another prior occupant sleeps in his car on Pacific Street (between Mound and Forrest Street).

His ex-wife and two daughters have not lived at 802 Mound for over two years.

I wish that this house could be sold and owned by someone who actually lives there and could consistently maintain the house and surrounding property. Since it is not an official rental property it is hard to understand the large volume of people who stay there for a few months and then a new group moves in.
