Skarda stated that during the ALJ hearing, the owner of the mall said that cameras were not allowed throughout the mall. Only Billy's and the bathroom nearby have cameras.

Councilmember Prince asked if one violation would be enough for a \$1000 matrix penalty.

Skarda confirmed yes.

Councilmember Yang asked if the item could be laid over.

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Skarda confirmed yes.

Council President Brendmoen spoke in favor.
