Approving the City's cost of providing Excessive Use of Inspection or Abatement services during October 22 to November 19, 2021, and setting date of Legislative Hearing for April 5, 2022 and City Council public hearing for May 18, 2022 to consider and levy the assessments against individual properties. (File No. J2208E, Assessment No. 228307)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Saint Paul Administrative Code Chapter 60: Property Service Cost Assessments, the Office of Financial Services Real Estate Section has prepared the attached Report of Completion of Assessment for Excessive Use of Inspection or Abatement Services for the Property Code Violations billed during the time period of October 22 to November 19, 2021 under Assessment No. 228307 (File No. J2208E); and,

WHEREAS, the Office of Financial Services Real Estate Section has prepared for City Council consideration the attached Assessment Roll listing the benefited property, the property owner, the service provided and the charges for the service as reported by the department providing the service; and hereby submits said Assessment Roll for City Council consideration to adopt and levy said charges as an assessment against the benefited property; and
