CORRECTION NOTICE - RE-INSPECTION COMPLAINT

RE: 920 CLARK ST

Dear Property Representative:

A re-inspection was made on your building on August 15, 2022, in response to a complaint. You are hereby notified that the following deficiencies must be corrected prior to re-inspection date. A reinspection will be made on August 30, 2022, at 2:00P.M.

Failure to comply may result in a criminal citation or the revocation of the Certificate of Occupancy. The Saint Paul Legislative Code requires that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional reinspection fees.

DEFICIENCY LIST

1. SPLC 40.12 ILLEGAL OCCUPANCY- No person shall occupy any building which does not have a fire certificate of occupancy. Any unit or structure which is so occupied shall be subject to section 34.23 of the legislative code relating to illegal occupancy. Such illegal occupancy also constitutes a hazard to the health safety or welfare of the occupants and the public and may be condemned by the appropriate enforcement officer under section 34.23 of the legislative code.-
2. SPLC 34.23, MSFC 111.1 - This occupancy is condemned as unsafe or dangerous. This occupancy must not be used until re-inspected and approved by this office.-
3. SPLC 34.19 - Provide access to the inspector to all areas of the building.-

4. MN Stat. 299F.362, MSFC 1103.8 - Immediately provide and maintain a smoke alarm located outside each sleeping area.-
5. MN Stat. 299F.51 - Immediately provide and maintain an approved Carbon Monoxide Alarm in a location within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Installation shall be in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.-

You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer.
