# **Truck/RV Parking**

- Multi-department work group has been discussing/working on this issue

    - West 359 (178 Tags)
    - Central 84 (35Tags)
    - East 59 (18 Tags)

### **Meter Parking**

- There are approximately 1,900\* meters in Saint Paul (prior to LRT, approximately 2,400) \* Additional meters being removed along Wabasha Street w/ new bike lane construction
- Meters are found in three main areas:
  - 1) Downtown, 2) Capitol Complex (surrounding areas), 3) University Avenue



# **Meter Parking**

- Enforced Mon-Sat from 8am-10pm; No Sundays or holidays
- Availability of meters can vary due to PW projects, permitted events,
  - maintenance, and other issues
    - Example:  $04/12/2022 \approx 200$  meters hooded
- PEOs have access through computer system to check real-time status

# **SPPD Parking Enforcement**

The <u>Parking Enforcement Unit</u> is the primary parking enforcement authority for the police department. Parking Enforcement Officers (PEOs) provide the vast majority of the police department's enforcement effort in regard to all parking regulations and help facilitate the safe movement of traffic.

What they do:

- They respond to calls for service and complaints.
- They conduct proactive patrol to enforce meters, permit zones, and timed parking in business districts.
- Issue citations to vehicles for violation of parking regulations.
- They assist in tag/tow operations for Public Works.
- They assist SPPD with administrative needs during Civil Unrest and/or emergencies, courtesy tows/moving cars.

There are currently 11 parking enforcement officers\*, working 7 days a week from 7 a.m. - 11 p.m. No Holidays.

\* Authorized strength is 12; additional hire is in process to meet authorized strength

# **SPPD Parking Enforcement Statistics**

- PEO calls for service in  $2021 \approx 17,000$ 
  - Of those calls, there were 8,727 parking meter violations

#### 1/1/2021 - 4/10/2021

#### 1,260 violations involving parking meters

- 1,252 were for expired meters
- 6 were for infringing on second metered space
- 2 were for parking at inoperable meter

#### 1/1/2022 - 4/10/2022

- 2,575 violations involving parking meters
  - 2,552 were for expired meters
  - 16 were for infringing on second metered space
  - 7 were for parking at inoperable meter
- <u>104% increase</u>
- Current pace puts citations over 10,000 for year
