#### Ticketing and Towing Office (managed by PW) (only open during Snow Emergencies)

- 651-266-9800, option 2 (request ticket and tow of car ONLY during CLEAN UP PHASE)
- Online reporting form to report a vehicle: <a href="www.stpaul.gov/snowticketing">www.stpaul.gov/snowticketing</a> (only open during Clean Up phase)
- After Snow Emergency ends (96 hours) call SPPD non-emergency at 651-291-1111 to report vehicles that have not moved in more than 48 hours.
- Snow Ticketers are SPPD Parking Enforcement Officers (PEOs) and temporary, on-call staff hired by PW.
- PW Ticketers follow the same Night and Day Plow Routes as the plows take
- PW Ticketers currently must hand-write all Snow Emergency Parking citations
- 2022-2023 snow season averaged 2,200 tickets issued and 700 tows per Snow Emergency

### Snow Impound Lot (managed by SPPD) - Cathlin Lot (open Nov through April 15)

- 651-502-7480 1129 Cathlin Street (across from the State Fairgrounds)
- <u>stpaul.gov/impound</u> to locate car by VIN or license plate
- To get a car out of impound lot, owner must be present with
  - Proof of vehicle ownership: title, bill of sale or lease agreement
  - Valid photo ID or driver's license
  - Proof of insurance for the vehicle
  - Cash, Visa, or Mastercard to pay (\$226.46 in 2024)
  - Keys to the vehicle

# **Snow Operations Facts and Information**

#### **Current Winter Maintenance Standards**

#### Arterial Streets (396 lane miles)

- Plowed and treated to bare pavement in drive lanes
- Plow compacted snow in parking lanes
- Plowed and treated during all winter events

#### Residential Streets (1,186 lane miles)

- Safe and passable
- Plow compacted snow
- Salt only high priority areas: hills & curves, intersections when slippery
- Only plowed during snow emergencies

#### Alleys (2,225 or 330 miles)

- Not plowed or salted by City
- Responsibility of abutting property owners
- Many property owners volunteer together and pay for private contractor by their "alley captain"

#### Winter Event: Any time Public Works responds to winter weather conditions

- Small: Anti-icing or deicing bridge decks overnight for frost (2-7 trucks)
- Medium: Salting and plowing operations on arterials and problem spots (residential hills, curves, etc.) with 2"-3" of snow (10-30 plows)
- Large (need to call in Forestry, Sewers and Traffic Ops staff with CDLs): Snow Emergency declared; plow all
  arterial and residential streets (70-80 plows)
  - Average 20-30 Winter Events per season.
  - 2022-2023 had 44 winter events, 7 Snow Emergencies, and 1-sided parking ban

#### **Garbage and Recycling**

- Do not put recycling and garbage carts in the street!
- Find out about winter weather collection delays stpaul.gov/wintercollection

#### **Communications & Engagement**

- Snow Emergency brochure mailed to 81,000+ residents (July)
  - Translated versions online: Spanish, Hmong, Somali, Oromo, Karen, Burmese, Lao
- GovDelivery emails & text alerts (5 languages) opted in 140,000 emails & texts
- Everbridge Resident Connect recorded voice message (new 2024)
  - English only, reaches 168,800 registered residents, businesses, and organizations
- Nextdoor 85,000 members
   Facebook 34,000 followers
- X/Twitter 83,800 followers
   Instagram (new 2024)

## **Snow Operations Facts**

- 1,800+ Lane Miles (maintained by PW; including 368 county and state lane miles maintained by PW by reimbursable maintenance agreement)
- Park trails and sidewalks inside parkland (Parks)
- Multi-use bike trails (could be PW or Parks depending on location)
- Bridge Sidewalks (PW Bridge Division)
- Bus Stop Shelters, Light Rail stations/tracks (Metro Transit)
- Sidewalks (abutting property owners; corner properties to clear ped ramps into street)
