This is the correspondence I let you know I would be sending.

The disability that Vicky Christiansen referred to in the hearing today is a traumatic brain injury. Very severe, from a car accident in 1979. It has resulted in many symptoms, including competitiveness, inappropriate sexual advances, and inability to form friendships, some paranoia, memory issues etc. She has often accused me, my wife Diane and my son Brice of going through her nightstand and touching her private "toys".

We have gone around and around with her leaving and she can never find an \$1,100.00 two bedroom lower duplex, heated, watered and garbaged with a full basement and a nice deck and she always ends up staying. In the most amazing ways actually, she has become a verb in our family lexicon where you tell her to do something and she just doesn't. In a way that makes you both dislike her and strangely respect her. It is referred to as "Just Vicky them"

She has made inappropriate sexual advances to every single person I know she has interacted with, and she does not take rejection well. She has made accusations against me that make me very nervous.

It's obvious she's not thinking clearly as she is working against her interests for nothing more than attention. Actively working against her ability to stay where she says she says she needs more time to move from. She has not given notice or been given notice. She gave the impression that she has been actively searching for another place to be. She is not and will end up in assisted living if she moves. She is a candidate for homelessness.

I think you can now understand why I chose not to have this conversation at the hearing.

Thank you for your attention and I will say that you declaring yourself a stickler for

grammar/spelling has delayed this letter quite a bit with many failures remaining I'm sure.
