Verne started with the water utility in July of 1958 as a junior civil engineer and was appointed assistant civil engineer of the water department in 1960. He was promoted to civil engineer III in 1964. In 1968 he became an assistant superintendent of the water department. In 1970 a title change had him named a civil engineer IV; later the same year he became the water production engineer. In 1984 he was appointed the assistant general manager of the water utility, the position from which he retired in 1992.

Verne went on to have a second career with TKDA and did consulting work with various water utilities in the area, including SPRWS.
