#### What is Library Go?

- Started in 2017
  - 42,334 Library Go records
  - Currently have 87,880 Library Go records as of March 2025
- Virtual e-card for students
  - Schools apply through SPPL's website
- Access to the library's print materials and e-resources
  - E-resources include e-books, e-audiobooks, databases and online tutoring
  - Students can check-out 10 physical books and 15 e-materials
- No financial risk for lost or stolen materials
  - Library staff use the opportunity to build connection with students and explain responsibilities of borrowing materials and caring for them

# Why is Library Go important?

- Students don't have to worry about losing their library go card, like they would a physical card
- Reduce barriers to access and promote equity
  - Connects all students to library materials and resources
  - There's no financial risk for parents if students lose or damage materials

Physical books checked out with a Library Go card

119,607

E-books were checked out with a Library Go card

Students checked out non-book items like audiobooks or accessing databases



## Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grant

- SPPL received a \$27,800 grant to dedicate to promotion of Library Go.
  - Data showed students on the Eastside were not utilizing Library Go
  - Close racial and economic opportunity gaps
  - Family Nights at 2 library locations
    - Hayden Heights, connected 7 schools: Frost Lake elementary, Hazel Park Prep Academy
    - Sun Ray Library, connected 4 schools: Battle Creek and Eastern Heights elementary
    - Talk with families about Library Go
    - Food and activities
  - Educator trainings with SPPS
  - Updating of all Library Go materials



### Library Go Family Nights

- Improvement both internally and externally around what Library go is
- Saw families who spoke several languages (Hmong, K'Nyaw, Spanish)
- SunRay Library is now seeing families that they didn't before
- Lots of families from Mobile Library stops
- Remind students about Library Go
- Families wanted to learn about more library programs/activities they could become involved in

#### **Educator Trainings**

- Six trainings for SPPS media staff during 2024-2025 school year
- Topics focused on most popular or useful resources, including:
  - Research databases
  - Libby (e-books)
  - Homework help at SPPL



#### **Updated Materials**

- Needed new materials to provide information about Library Go based on stakeholder audience
- Updated with new brand and audience-aligned messaging
- Classroom posters, flyers for families, wallet-size cards and iPad clings
- Postcards to all Kindergarten families this spring and fall 2025

- Students don't know they have Library Go or they need a reminder
- Confusion about it being just for school
- Where can students keep their Library Go barcode so it's easily accessible (more so with students in K-2)
- Some families who have heard about Library Go in school, don't know how to translate it to public library use
