### Revocation of Fire Certificate of Occupancy and Order to Vacate

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on August 28, 2020, for the renewal of the Certificate of Occupancy. Since you have failed to comply with the applicable requirements, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy in accordance with Section 40.06 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code. A reinspection will be made on October 5, 2020 at 2:30P.M. or the property vacated on October 14,2020.

The Saint Paul Legislative Code further provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. Failure to immediately complete the following deficiency list or the building vacated may result in a criminal citation.

#### DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. Bedroom East Side - MSFC 1030.1 - Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room or area, or discontinue use of area as a sleeping room. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.-
- 2. Kitchen - SPLC 34.10 (7) - Repair and maintain the cabinets in an approved manner.-Repair or replace the damaged or missing door.
- 3. Upstairs bathroom - MSFC 3504.1.1 - Provide approved shielding from combustibles to prevent sparks, slag or heat from igniting exposed combustibles.-Stop burning incent. The incent is jammed into the wall and will drop sparks when lit.
- 4. Upstairs bathroom - MSFC 308 - Immediately, discontinue the use of all unapproved open flames.-Stop burning incent.,

- 5. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.35 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.-
- 6. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
- 7. MSFC 605.5 Discontinue use of extension cords used in lieu of permanent wiring.-
- 8. SPLC 34.09 (4), 34.33 (3) Repair and maintain the window glass.-
- 9. MSFC 605.1- All light fixtures shall be maintained with protective globes if originally equipped.-
