

# 2025 Legislative Priorities



#### **STATE BUDGET & FORECAST DEADLINES**

- FY 2026-27 projected surplus of \$456 million
- Projected \$6 billion shortfall in out years (FY 2028-29)
- Higher inflation increases revenue and spending forecast
- Shifting policies at federal level create forecast uncertainty
- Policy Deadline: April 4
- Finance Deadline: April 11
- Legislative Session ends May 19 at midnight
- Constitutional requirement to balance the budget by June 30

- CUB Tax Credit: HF 457 (Harder) / SF 768 (Mohamed)
- Redevelopment TIF Citywide: HF 2574 (Hollins) / SF 2824 (Pappas)
- Redevelopment TIF Downtown District 17: HF 2585 (Hollins) / SF 2820 (Pappas)

- Maintain the city's 4(d) Housing Incentive Program
- Tenant Protections
- Support for Saint Paul property tax-payers through state-funded property tax reduction programs, renters' credits, more outreach to homeowners about property tax assistance/reduction options, and automatic state-level tax refunds



### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

- Ban Firearms in Publicly-Owned Buildings: HF 1601 (Hussein) / SF 2320 (Pappas)
- Fencing Consortium: SF 2709 (Kreun)
- **Public Safety Aid:** HF 2189 (Norris) / SF 387 (Gustafson)
- Account for SPPD and State Patrol Police Costs: HF 2818 (Stier)
  Recruitment and retention resources for public safety first responders
- Maintain copper wire theft law
- **OPPOSE bills that harm new Americans,** including but not limited to:
  - ICE Cooperation Requirement for Local Law Enforcement: HF 16 (Rymer) / SF 643 (Koran)



#### **WORKFORCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

- **Right Track Program Expansion:** HF 2262 (Hussein) / SF 2658 (Hawj)
- **Support for Saint Paul Small Businesses:** HF SF 2520 (Hawj) appropriating grants for Arcade Street and East 7th businesses impacted by construction; and HF XXXX (Pérez-Vega) appropriating grants to the West Side Business Coalition
- World Juniors Hockey Championship Funding: HF 1007 (Norris) / SF 1061 (Frentz)
- OPPOSE: ReConnect Rondo Expenditure Prohibition: HF 494 (West) / SF 286 (Jasinski)



#### **PARKS & OUTDOORS**

- Como Park Zoo Operations Legacy Funding: HF 1560 (Finke) / SF 1152 (Oumou Verbeten)
- Como Park Geothermal Funding: HF 1656 (Hollins) / SF 2220 (Oumou Verbeten)
- Metro Parks Legacy bill: Not yet introduced
- **Regional Parks & Trails Bonding:** HF 1815 (Lillie) / SF 2130 (Pappas)
- Lake Phalen Winter Festival: HF 1544 (Lee) / SF 1763 (Hawj) Ice Castles Funding



#### LIFELONG LEARNING

In the City of Saint Paul, everyone deserves the opportunity to learn and grow over the course of their entire life, from infants and toddlers to aging adults.

- **Support increased funding** for early childhood learning and care through SPPS and Parks programming
- **Support new state funding** for competitive grants for after-school and summer programs targeted to low-income youth



### **ECONOMIC JUSTICE & INCLUSION**

- Statewide guaranteed income
- Statewide \$15 minimum wage
- Elimination of sub-minimum wages for people with disabilities
- Rent-a-bank reform
- Low-cost motor vehicle insurance program for low-income residents: HF 2215 (Hollins) / SF 2455 (Putnam)



### **LOCAL CONTROL & RESOURCES**

- Increase to statewide LGA
- **Support more local control a**nd oppose unfunded mandates on local governments
- **Open Meeting Law reform** to allow remote participation by community volunteers serving on local boards and commissions
- Support investments in broadband to ensure affordable, high-capacity internet access, and digital literacy training and support is available to all Saint Paul residents




### **HUMAN RIGHTS & PROCUREMENT**

- Labor Standards Data Practices: Protect labor standards complainants and witnesses upon closure of a case
- **Subpoena Power:** Authorize the Saint Paul City Council to delegate subpoena power to HREEO for both human rights and labor standards investigations
- Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)
- **Statewide procurement requirement updates** to allow cities the same authority as counties for more flexibility in contracting under \$250,000 with small businesses and veteran-owned/operated businesses



#### SAINT PAUL PUBLIC LIBRARY

- Increased funding for Regional Library Basic System Support (RLBSS) and Regional Library Telecommunication Aid (RLTA), and continuing access to Legacy/Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund for public library programs
- **Renovations** of the Hayden Heights and Riverview libraries to enhance their ability to meet community learning, work, and wellbeing needs
- Additional funding for library construction and remodeling grants to fund safety and renovations
