CARTER: Yes, I have certainly heard from no shortage of folk throughout the city and in Ward 1 about this with the concern that removing -- that making allowance for less than 90 percent can have the impact of decreasing the neighborhood and community members role and we obviously had a good conversation, I think, in this body last week and some of those concerns were addressed for me, specifically the understanding that if less than 60 percent of those signatures are achieved that the District Council approval is absolutely required, that a good faith effort with specific regard to specific addresses is required as well.

I think this has gotten where it needs to

be, so I will be supportive of it.

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MS. LANTRY: Mr. Helgen.

MR. HELGEN: This process
generally makes me somewhat uncomfortable,
although I believe Council Member Harris and
others have worked hard to try to put some
neighborhood protections in here, so I think
at this point I will probably be supportive
of this, but kind of reserve judgment later.

MS. LANTRY: Mr. Bostrom.

MR. BOSTROM: I just think it's important to note that with the discussion that we had last time is that when somebody comes in they don't make the 90 percent and the 60 is really the threshold and they get to 60 percent and said, okay, here it is council, approve this, we don't have to do that and I think this really is going to force anybody that wants to do that, they are going to have to get out there and work and demonstrate that they did work and we still have the ability to deny it, so I think if there's individual council members around this table that are having problems in certain areas, there's a lot of discretion
