

Organization History The Saint Paul Police Department was founded in 1854 and has continually served the city of Saint Paul

The Saint Paul Police Department serves the nearly 300,000 residents and more than 23,000 businesses in Minnesota's capital city, an area that covers almost 52 square miles. The department is made up of 6,110 sworn employees and 193 civilian employees. The department's partnership with the city includes having 80 reserves and a number of volunteers who are regularly called upon to help with the city's many major special events.

The department's employees serve the community at a number of volunteer events, including the annual "Red and Blue Cares" event, where police officers team with Saint Paul firefighters to help families shop for a Thanksgiving Day dinner. The annual Target "Shop with a Cop" event helps children buy holiday gifts for family members. One of our showcase volunteer events is called "Cops & Kids" - every holiday season, dozens of police employees deliver gives too seriously ill children at local hospitals. In the summer, many officers enjoy the volunteer coaching opportunities through the Police Athletic League.

In addition to the residents, business people and others who regularly travel to Saint Paul, the police department works to serve the millions of visitors who come to the city for the National Hockey League's Minnesota Wild, events at the Ordway Center for Performing Arts and hundreds of other attractions, including parks, concerts, festivals and museums.

Organization Goals

Improve the safety and security of the Capital City - Community members need to not only be safe in the areas where they live, work, visit and gather, they also need to feel safe. With this as our goal, we will work to ensure that we are serving our community through crime prevention and intervention while enforcing the laws to protect the capital city.

Partner with our community to enhance Saint Paul's vitality and prosperity - Police officers alone will not be successful in addressing criminal activity. The Saint Paul Police Department depends on an involved community to work in partnership with our officers. We depend on our community members to help us with crime prevention and intervention strategies.

Manage our resources for maximum results - Law enforcement is not immune to the tight fiscal realities like those faced by the people we serve. We must work in efficient ways today that we may have not known existed in the past. We must be creative in our approaches to securing resources and hold ourselves accountable in the use of those resources. We will do this while still passionately fulfilling our responsibility to our community members, working to provide them the safest living environment possible.

Strengthen a culture that values trusted service and accountability - Beyond the police department's mission of promoting safe and healthy neighborhoods and larger conceptual goals, our officers know that they often are the first to see our community members in challenging situations in need of our assistance. A surveillance camera captured the incident on video but it was very difficult to see important details. We brought the video to Target's Forensic Video Analysis unit in Brooklyn Park, and they were able to enhance it. We understand the importance of Forensic Video Enhancement and are in the process of expanding our capabilities. This program will allow us to assign appropriate resources. Since surveillance video has become more cost effective and better quality, the need to effectively analyze it will only grow in the future.
