Kyle Lundgren, Assistant City Attorney representing the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI), described the violations. He said DSI's recommendation was a matrix penalty of a \$150 fine and a license suspension until compliance is verified. He said that penalty was not an upward departure, and the prior license history was one prior violation of the same nature in 2008.

(Councilmember Carter joined the meeting at this time.)

Bob Alt, TAHER, Inc director of purchasing, said they didn't question the violations. He described the circumstances at each of the two inspections and corrective actions taken since. He said they took this very seriously.

Council President Lantry asked whether they were asking to not have to pay the fine. Mr. Alt said his concern was their reputation and not the fine. He said they were trained and took care of their issues. He said he would like to have the inspector come back out to inspect and was surprised there hadn't been follow up.

Sarah Van Scoy, food service director, described the corrective actions and training she had instituted since the initial violation. She said TAHER had their own Critical Control person who conducted training and inspections.

Councilmember Thune moved to close the public hearing. Yeas - 7 Nays - 0

Mr. Lundgren clarified that the notice of violation said that TAHER could call and schedule a reinspection at any time.

Councilmember Thune said he was glad they had come in for the public hearing because it underscored their years in business and good track record. He said they could schedule a reinspection before the resolution took effect and not lose any business, and the \$150 penalty wasn't that big a deal. He moved to adopt the recommendation of DSI.

Appeal of Mohamed Sewidan to a Deficiency List at 290 STINSON STREET.

Legislative Hearing Officer Marcia Moermond said the appeal was of orders related to a flat basement ceiling which was 6'4" in height. She said that was substantially short of the required 7' over 50% of the space, and her recommendation was to deny the appeal. She said the item was being brought in under suspension because there was a prospective tenant who would need to find other living arrangements if the appeal was denied.

In opposition:

Mohamed Sewidan (1373 Simpson) said he had bought the house in 2004 in its current condition and had lived there before renting it out two years ago. He said he believed the ceiling regulation had taken effect in 2006 and might not apply to his property. He said the last tenant had moved out in July, and he couldn't afford both mortgages. He said the ceiling height was 6'4", there were three egress windows, and a door to back yard providing plenty of egress. He asked for generosity from the Council.

Councilmember Helgen moved to close the public hearing. Yeas - 7 Nays - 0

Ms. Moermond said adequate egress not the issue in this case, but the concern was operating within the room with the extremely short ceiling.

Councilmember Helgen said that as someone who was 6'4" tall he thought the ceiling was too short. He moved to deny the appeal.
