Dear Council Members,

Today I received a notice of plans for a paving and lighting project associated with my address at 2311 Edgcumbe Road, St. Paul, MN 55116. The total proposed assessment for this project as it concerns my property, which runs along Edgcumbe to the north, and Fairview to the west, was priced at \$16,356.40. There is also a sewer project that has been ongoing at the intersection of Fairview and Edgcumbe. This project comes with a cost of a \$3,294.00 fee paid to the City to establish a new sewer connection. Although optional, however, if this is not done during the construction process, the City advised that a property owner would then be responsible for street repair should a problem arise in the future.

These two projects, should the street paving be approved, would result in just short of a \$20,000 cost and assessment in the same year for my property. Although the option of stretching the assessment over 20 years is possible, this is an remarkably large sum of money on top of existing taxes to be paid. I am expressing my concern over this onerous financial burden.

I would ask if it would be possible at this time to not continue the project on Fairview to the end of my property, but instead have the Fairview portion of paving and lighting be included in a future project to make the cost of the assessment more financially feasible. Your consideration in this matter is appreciated.
