



CITY OF SAINT PAUL, MINNESOTA

1 WHEREAS, Grand American Restaurant Company, doing business as The Wild Onion (I.D.
2 #19990002357), 788 Grand Avenue, has applied for a class N license to add a Liquor Outdoor
3 Service Area (Patio) license (to permit the extension of liquor service onto an existing patio) to its
4 existing Liquor on Sale -- 181-290 Seats, Liquor on Sale -- Sunday, Liquor on Sale -- 2 AM Closing,
5 Entertainment (B), Gambling Location, Restaurant (5) -- 151 and Over, Restaurant (D) -- Add-on (Bar
6 Only), Sidewalk Cafe, and Cigarette/Tobacco licenses; and

8 ~~WHEREAS, the Wild Onion's residential properties are within a 300 feet radius of licensee's~~
9 ~~proposed patio and outdoor liquor service area; and licensee must seek consent of neighboring~~
10 ~~residential properties and demonstrate that s/he were able to obtain 90% approval or, in the lesser~~
11 ~~case, 60% or more approval; and~~

13 ~~WHEREAS, licensee sought support from a list of private residences provided by the Department of~~
14 ~~Safety and Inspection by mailing letters and conducted follow up surveys and licensee was unable~~
15 ~~to obtain the ninety percent (90%) consent or, in the lesser case, sixty percent (60%); and~~

17 WHEREAS, § 409.06 (g) requires that an applicant for a liquor outdoor service area (patio) license
18 submit with his or her application a statement in writing with the signatures of as many owners of
19 private residences, dwellings and apartment houses within three hundred (300) feet of such
20 premises as he or she can obtain to the effect that they have no objection to the granting of the
21 license; and

22
23 WHEREAS, § 409.06 (g) further explains that in the event the applicant obtains signatures from less
24 than sixty (60) percent of the above-mentioned property owners, that the license will not be granted
25 unless the licensee can demonstrate a good faith effort was made to fulfill petition requirements, the
26 results of attempts to fulfill the petition requirements demonstrated a generally favorable
27 disposition toward the licensed activity and that the district council representing the area supports
28 the request for the license; and

30 WHEREAS, the license applicant in this case presented signatures from only thirty three (33) percent
31 of the above-mentioned property owners; and

33 ~~WHEREAS, Council finds that the Wild Onion's efforts constitute a good faith effort to fulfill all~~
34 ~~petition requirements per City of Saint Paul Legislative Code 409.06(g) (2) (c), and that the results of~~
35 ~~the attempts to obtain signatures showed a generally favorable disposition from the surrounding~~
36 ~~community (thirty three percent (33%) of residential owners and the Summit Hill Association)~~
37 ~~toward the proposed licensed activity; and~~

39 ~~WHEREAS, Council finds that issuance of the license will not unduly interfere with the reasonable~~
40 ~~use and enjoyment of neighboring property and residences and will not bear adversely on the~~
41 ~~health, safety, morals and general welfare of the community; and~~

43 WHEREAS, following the legislative hearing conducted on April 15, 2010, there was an agreement
44 relating to certain conditions made between Grand American Restaurant Company, doing business
45 as **The Wild Onion (I.D. #19990002357)**, and the Summit Hill Association that would make the
46 application to add a **Liquor Outdoor Service Area (Patio) license (to permit the extension of liquor**
47 **service onto an existing patio)** workable for the **Grand Avenue** location; and
48

49 WHEREAS, the Deputy Legislative Hearing Officer recommends that the application for a **Liquor**
50 **Outdoor Service Area (Patio) license (to permit the extension of liquor service onto an existing**
51 **patio)** for Wild Onion be approved with the following conditions:
52

53 Existing License Conditions

- 54 1. The management of The Wild Onion shall provide security in the parking lots Tuesday
55 through Saturday at bar closing to ensure that the patrons leave the premises and the
56 parking lots without causing a disturbance in the surrounding neighborhoods. Patrons
57 shall be advised of the necessity of leaving in an orderly manner and shall not be permitted
58 to loiter outside the bar or in the parking lots.
- 59 2. The sidewalk cafe is an extension of the restaurant operation onto a part of the public
60 sidewalk which immediately adjoins the licensed premises.
- 61 3. No sidewalk cafe shall be permitted in any portion of the public sidewalk where normal
62 pedestrian traffic flow is obstructed. A minimum clearance width of thirty-six (36) inches
63 must be maintained on the public sidewalk at all times.
- 64 4. No tables, chairs or any other furnishings, except plant tubs, shall be placed in the area
65 used for the sidewalk cafe during any period when the sidewalk cafe is not open and being
66 operated. While such cafe is in operation, all tables and chairs shall be kept in a clean,
67 sanitary condition.
- 68 5. The use of a portion of the public sidewalk as a sidewalk cafe shall not be an exclusive use.
69 All public improvements, including but not limited to trees, light poles, traffic signals, pull
70 boxes or manholes, or any public-initiated maintenance procedures, shall take precedence
71 over said use of the public sidewalk at all times.
- 72 6. It shall be the duty of the licensed food establishment to maintain each plant tub at all
73 times in a safe condition at its proper location and to inspect each such tub periodically in
74 order that it may be properly maintained. Trees or plants and their tubs shall at all times
75 be kept in a neat, clean and presentable condition. No advertising matter or sign or
76 writing of any kind shall be displayed upon any tree or plant or its tub.
- 77 7. No liquor sales and/or service is allowed on a public sidewalk without prior approval and
78 additional licensing from the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI).
- 79 8. No outdoor food and/or beverage preparation is allowed on a public sidewalk without
80 prior approval and additional licensing from DSI.
81

82 Additional License Conditions

- 83 9. The outdoor patio seating area shall closed at 9:30 p.m. each night of the week, and there
84 shall be no customers, patrons and/or employees (other than management and security
85 personnel patrolling the area) allowed on the patio for any reason after this time. These
86 restrictions do not include the smoking area.
- 87 10. There shall be no music (recorded or live) on the patio.
- 88 11. The licensee shall implement sufficient security measures to insure that alcohol is not
89 consumed in the parking lot or public right-of-way. The Wild Onion will assign full-time
90 security to continuously monitor all Wild Onion patron parking lots from 9:30 p.m. to ½
91 hour after 2 AM closing, five (5) days per week, Tuesday night through Saturday
92 evening/early Sunday morning.
- 93 12. There shall be no bar (temporary or permanent) outside on the patio unless prior written
94 approval and the proper license(s) are first obtained from DSI.
- 95 13. The Wild Onion will provide food and drink service on the patio only to patrons seated at
96 tables. No stand-up service will be provided for any patron and no loitering is allowed by
97 patrons who are not seated.
- 98 14. No liquor service will be provided to patrons who do not order food.
- 99 15. The Wild Onion will participate in a task force to be created by the Summit Hill
100 Association (SHA) to address and minimize problems associated with late night patron
101 behavior.
- 102 16. The patio liquor license will expire on November 14, 2010. The licensee will be required to
103 reapply one (1) time for the patio liquor permit to continue liquor service in 2011 and
104 future seasons. In order to get the license reissued, the licensee will be required to go
105 through the regular license application process for patio liquor licenses with the exception
106 of the requirement for submission of a petition. Standard notification procedure will be
107 followed for neighborhood review. After review, a recommendation on the application
108 will be made by SHA to the city council. The Saint Paul City Council has the final
109 authority to reissue the license.

111 ~~THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Saint Paul hereby approves this~~
112 ~~license application. Now, therefore be it~~

114 RESOLVED, that the Council finds that the Wild Onion's efforts constitute a good faith effort to
115 fulfill all petition requirements per City of Saint Paul Legislative Code 409.06(g) (2) (c); and be it

117 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the district council representing the area supports the request for the
118 license; and be it

120 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the license applicant has failed to show that the results of the attempts
121 to satisfy the signature requirements showed a generally favorable disposition toward the licensed
122 activity; and be it

124 FINALLY RESOLVED, that the license application is referred to the City Attorney for adverse
125 action.
