Sound Level Variance for the High School for Performing Arts June 11, 2014

Description of Variance

Location: High School for Recording Arts, 1166 University Avenue West

Noise Source: The High School for Performing Arts has applied for a sound level variance for the Outdoor Music Performance Event to allow amplified music and announcements from 12:00 Noon and 9:00 PM on June 11, 2014. The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) recommends the following conditions: 1) The variance will be for the hours from 12:00 Noon to 9:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 11, 2014 for the Music Performance Event to be held at a parking lot located near 1166 University Avenue 2) All electronically powered equipment used in conjunction with the event must not exceed 85 dBA, as measured at 50 feet from the sound source. 3) The applicant will provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with these conditions. 4) All electronically powered equipment, PA systems, loudspeakers or similar devices must be turned off no later than 9:00 p.m. on the event date.
