- using GIS, drawings, and written instructions under the general direction of a supervisor.
- Respond to service calls regarding water quality, pressure, and leaks, and troubleshoots the issues.
 Respond to situations such as flooding as required.
- Operate job-related equipment including compactors, street saws, pumps, and pneumatic equipment to achieve assigned tasks.

This position may be required to respond to after-hours calls, over-time, and emergency situations.

Position Requirements

One year of experience as a water utility worker II or equivalent performing work on water distribution systems such as repairing or installing water mains, water services, valves or hydrants. OR

Two years of experience as a water utility worker I or equivalent performing manual labor supporting the construction, maintenance, and repairs of water distribution systems or utilities.
