### **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

Sound Level Variances

## **Big River Pizza – Let There Be Songs to Phil the Air- Friday**

Dear St. Paul Property Owner:

This is to inform you of a request for a variance from the sound level limitations as indicated in the St. Paul Noise Ordinance (Chapter 293 of the St. Paul Legislative Code). Property owned by you and located near the noise source, may be affected by this variance request. Rental property owners must provide a copy of this notice to all renters or post a copy in a common area of the building so it can be viewed by the occupants.

#### **Description of Variance:**

**Location:** St. Paul Farmers Market, 290 5<sup>th</sup> Street East

**Noise Source:** Big River Pizza has requested a sound level variance, at a requested sound level limit of 90 dBA at 50 feet from the sound source, to provide the use of a sound system with amplified music for the Let There Be Songs to Phil the Air Friday event. The variance is requested for the hours of 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., with a pre-event sound check from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Friday, October 1st, 2021 at St. Paul Farmers Market. The Department of Safety and Inspections will be recommending the following conditions: 1) The Variance shall be for the hours of 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., with a pre-event sound check from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., for Let There Be Songs to Phil the Air on Friday, October 1st, 2021 as listed above. 2) All electronically powered equipment used in conjunction with the event shall not exceed 90 dBA as measured 50 feet from any sound source. 3) The applicant shall provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with the sound level variance conditions. 4) All electronically powered equipment, PA systems, loudspeakers or similar devices shall be turned off no later than 10:00 p.m. on the date of the event.

Applicant has acknowledged that any social gathering associated with this variance must be managed in full compliance with all applicable Governor Walz and Mayor Carter COVID-19 Orders including but not limited to Orders relating to distancing, mask wearing and attendance limits
