Synopsis :

On 05.27.2024 at approximately 0447 hours, Officers were dispatched to the area of 276 Exchange Street South for a report of hearing glass break. Officers located a broken window of the residence and located five juveniles inside the residence. The address was on the vacant list and juveniles were turned over to parents. See report for more information.

Narrative :

On 05.27.2024 at approximately 0447 hours, I, Officer Heuer and Officer Z. Moore (210) were dispatched to the area of 276 Exchange Street S St Paul MINNESOTA 55102 (Fore Paughs restaurant) for a report of hearing glass break around 430am and is believed to be coming from this address due to the place being under construction.

When we arrived on scene, I noticed a flashlight from inside near the main entrance and I then located a broken glass window on the Southeast corner. I requested more squads to respond at this time, I announced myself as St. Paul Police and gave commands to come out. I heard a voice state they were coming out and five juveniles came out from the broken window. I gave commands to all the juveniles to get on the ground on the porch where they were taken into custody without incident.

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Dispatch aired to officers that the house was on the vacant list and there were signs posted on the front door "No trespassing". Other squads arrived on scene and cleared the building without locating anyone else inside.

The one party I had detained was placed in the rear of my squad and was verbally identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was read his Miranda rights due to him being in handcuffs and he stated he was staying at his cousin's house with another friend when they got picked up by a female named [REDACTED] who was also detained. [REDACTED] stated they arrived in a black Honda pilot around 430am and had heard about this place online about it being haunted. [REDACTED] stated the window was broken prior to them arriving and none of them broke the window. [REDACTED] stated they were inside for a short period of time and then were going to leave but saw the officers arrive on scene. [REDACTED] stated they got scared when they saw officers and then came out when the officers told them to come out.

[REDACTED] provided his mother's information who was verbally identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came and picked up [REDACTED] on scene.

See other officer's supplemental reports for more information on the other juveniles that were on scene. All juveniles were verbally trespassed and advised no citations were given today but could be given later on.

Pictures were taken of the scene and uploaded to axon capture.

Officers were unable to contact the owners of the resident and unknown how much the window replacement would be.

Sgt. Slagter (200) was advised of the incident.

Narrative :

On 05/27/2024 at 0458 hours, I, SQD#217 (J. Johnson) responded to 276 Exchange St S to assist other squads with a report of sound of glass breaking and the sound prying come from the area. SQD#210 (Z. Moore and T. Heuer) stated they had people still inside the building and requested emergency traffic. See other reports for additional information.

I arrived on scene and five juveniles were already in custody. I took control of a juvenile female, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] and she was placed into the back of my marked patrol squad #1761. I identified [REDACTED] verbally and ran her through the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) to confirm her identity, which came back clear of any warrants.

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I read [REDACTED] the Miranda warning word for word and pausing at each right to ask if she understood her rights, which she stated, "Yes," to each right. I then asked if she was willing to speak to me about what happened today, she stated, "Yes."

[REDACTED] stated that she and her friends were looking up haunted places and learned that 276 Exchange St S had a good ghost to investigate. I asked her who threw the rock to get inside the building, she stated that no one threw a rock to break a window. I asked [REDACTED] where she got the green tag keys from, she stated from the green platform tractor that was parked in the lot and that she wasn't going to take them or was gonna use the equipment. [REDACTED] stated that her and her friends were being dumb teenagers to trespass into where they didn't belong. I asked [REDACTED] who I can get in contact with and she stated her mother, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED].

I attempted to call [REDACTED] three times but the the line never rang or let me leave a voicemail. Officer Heuer advised me that we would be charging all parties with MISD Trespass and MISD Criminal Damage to Property. Officer Heuer also advised us to verbally trespass all parties.

I went back to my marked patrol squad and advised [REDACTED] that she was trespassed from 276 Exchange St S for one year (05/27/2024 - 05/27/2025) at that if she comes back within that time she could be arrested for trespassing. [REDACTED] stated she understood. I had [REDACTED] exit the back of my squad removed the handcuffs from her wrists and drove her to her vehicle at a parking lot near 313 Sherman St.

I added the 2009 Blue HOND PILOT [REDACTED] SPORT UTILITY VEHICLE, that [REDACTED] was driving to the call.

SQD#200 (SGT C. Slagter) was notified of the incident.

Narrative :

On 05/27/2024 at approximately 0447 hours, I, Squad 229 (J. HSER) was dispatched to 276 Exchange Street S on a Suspicious Call.

Cad comments stated " COMP HEARD GLASS BREAKING AROUND 0430 HOURS.. THEN HEARD 3 HAMMER BLOWS AND PRYING NOISES... POSS COMING FROM THE AREA OF FOREPAUGHS RESTAURANT".

Upon arrival, I made contact with one of the suspects on scene. I identified one of the suspects as [REDACTED].

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I escorted [REDACTED] back to my Squad car and placed him in the back of my squad (1562). Prior to questioning [REDACTED] I read him the Miranda Warning and he stated he understood all his rights and was willing to talk to me about what had happened. [REDACTED] made the following statements:

[REDACTED] said he and his other four friends saw this building/ Property (276 Exchange Street S) online and wanted to come check it out and see what's inside the property. He stated when they arrived on scene he saw the window was crack opened and they all went inside through the crack opened window. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew anything about the broken window and he said no. He said when he and his friends got to the address, the broken window was already there and he had nothing to do with him

I contacted [REDACTED] mother, [REDACTED] and informed her of what happened. I asked [REDACTED] if she was willing to come pick up her son, [REDACTED] due to the incident and she said she would be on her way. Shortly after I spoke with [REDACTED], one of [REDACTED] friends' mother arrived on scene and stated [REDACTED] could go with her. I contacted [REDACTED] mother again and asked if she was okay with her son, [REDACTED] going home with his friend's mother and she said he could. She advised she knows [REDACTED] friend's mother and she's the family friend.

[REDACTED] was released on scene and took off with his friend in his friend's mother's vehicle.

Squad 200 was advised.

No citation was issued at this time.

At approximately 0615, the board up crew arrived on scene and I directed him to where the broken window was and left the scene.

On 05/27/2024 at approximately 0447 hours, I, Officer A. Martell (224) was dispatched to 276 Exchange St S to a report of the complainant hearing the sound of glass break at approximately 0430 hours followed by 3 hammer blows and pry noises. The complainant believed it was coming from the area around Forepaugh's Restaurant (276 Exchange St S). While I was enroute to the call, I heard Sqd. 210 (Ofcs. T. Heuer / Z. Moore) air on the radio that a light could be seen inside the

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business and there was a broken window on the southeast corner. I arrived on scene and assisted Officer Heuer with calling 5 juveniles out of the broken window. All 5 juveniles were ordered to prone out on the platform just outside the broken window. All the juveniles were compliant and were detained in handcuffs.

I took one of the juveniles and put him in my squad car (2366). I identified him as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that him and his 4 friends had learned that Forepaugh's Restaurant is supposed to be haunted. They all met up in Cottage Grove, MN before driving to the restaurant in a single vehicle. All 5 juveniles are from Cottage Grove. [REDACTED] stated the window was already broken when they got to the restaurant. He stated the 5 of them entered the building and were exploring inside when officers arrived on scene and called them out.

There were rocks just inside the broken window along with wet footprints from the juveniles. With the findings on scene along with the report of the complainant, it is believed that one of the juveniles broke the window. However, they all deny breaking it.

I contacted [REDACTED] mother, who was identified as [REDACTED]. I informed her of the situation and asked her if she would come to St. Paul to pick up [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] drove to St. Paul and [REDACTED] was released to her. I provided [REDACTED] with a business card and a case number.

Narrative :

On 05/27/2024 at approximately 0447 hours Officer Heuer and I, Officer Z. Moore (Squad 210) responded to the area of Irvine Park for the report of a suspicious call where the caller woke up to the sound of glass breaking and someone prying on something.

The caller, McCormick, Keith Allen (DOB/1948-08-06, C/P: 651-224-0678, Address/ 30 Irvine Park) woke up around 0430-0445 hours to the sound of the breaking glass. The caller did not see anything but only could hear the sounds. The caller also stated that the sound of breaking glass sounded as if it was coming from "Forepaughs" (276 Exchange Street S). MCCORMICK was contacted after the call to see if there was any additional information. MCCORMICK stated that he did not have any additional information and did not see anything but only heard the sounds and thought that it was too early for construction crews to be working.

As we were driving into the area I could see a flashlight inside of the front door of the address. The address looked as if it was under renovation and as if no one was living at the address. Officer began walking around the address and Officer Heuer located a broken window on the southeast corner of the address. Five juveniles that were "Urban Exploring" at the address were called out and taken into custody. See his report for more information.

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Prior to the juveniles exiting the address, I heard the exterior door on the west side of the address open and close. No one came out of the door, but I remained on the west side of the address holding the door. Officers eventually entered and cleared the address from any other occupants. No one else was located. It also should be noted that there were no damages to the inside of the address located by police other than the exterior window on the southeast corner.

I contacted Ramsey County Dispatch to have them send out a board up crew to have the window that was broken covered.
