This is to inform you of a request for a variance from the sound level limitations as indicated in the St. Paul Noise Ordinance (Chapter 293 of the St. Paul Legislative Code). Property owned by you and located near the noise source, may be affected by this variance request. Description of Variance:

Location: State Capitol – 75 Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.

Noise Source: Cystic Fibrosis Foundation has requested a sound level variance in order to present music and announcements for the St. Paul Great Strides at the State Capitol. The variance is requested at a sound level limit of 87 decibels (dBA), at no specified distance, for the hours of 11:00 a.m. until 1:30 p.m., on Sunday, May 19, 2019. The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) recommends the following conditions: 1. The Variance shall be for the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., on Sunday, May 19, 2019. 2. All electronically powered equipment used in conjunction with the event shall not exceed 87 dBA as measured at 50 feet from the sound source. 3. The applicant shall provide personnel and equipment to monitor sound level limits as specified in Condition #2. 4. All electronically powered sound equipment, PA systems, loudspeakers or similar devices shall be turned off no later than 1:30 p.m. on the event date.
