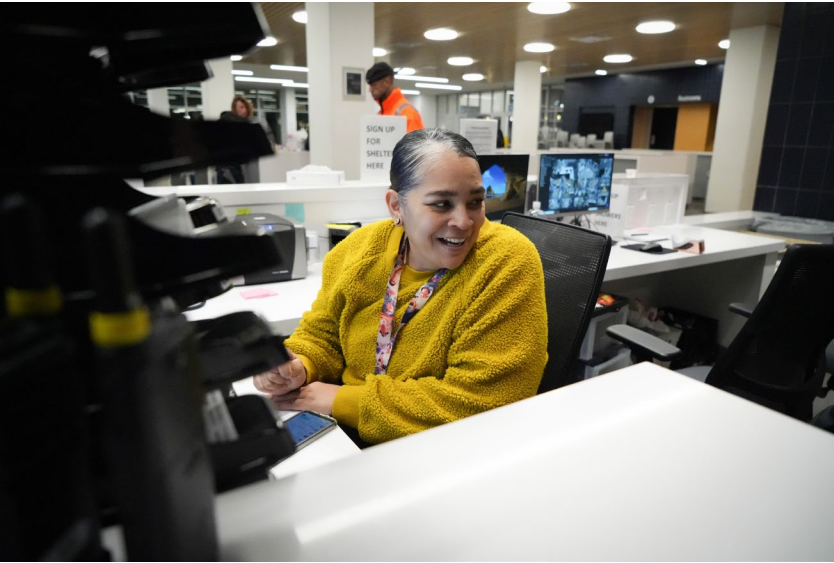

Daytime Emergency Shelter Services

A one-stop service hub to help people meet their basic needs and access services offering pathways to greater stability.

Advancing creative solutions that work.

Housing-focused Behavioral Health Team (HBST)

A specialized group of case managers and behavioral health professionals who offer intensive case management services and housing placement assistance to especially vulnerable, high-needs clients.

Safety, Security & Emergency Preparedness Team

An unarmed security and crisis response team trained in trauma-informed verbal de-escalation and physical restraint techniques. This team patrols the campus 24/7, regularly responding to clients in crisis or engaging in unsafe behaviors, and coordinates and administers the agency's Narcan training program.

Focus Forward

A specialized 32-bed shelter unit focusing on especially vulnerable clients with complex needs. The program was founded in partnership with Ramsey County during the pandemic and is currently scheduled to cease operations on July 1, 2024, as funding expires.



More people are seeking help.

Between 2022 and 2023:

- 13% increase in Twin Cities homelessness.
- 28% increase in number of Catholic Charities clients, topping 25,000 for the first time.
- 37% increase in the number of people served at St. Paul Opportunity Center.





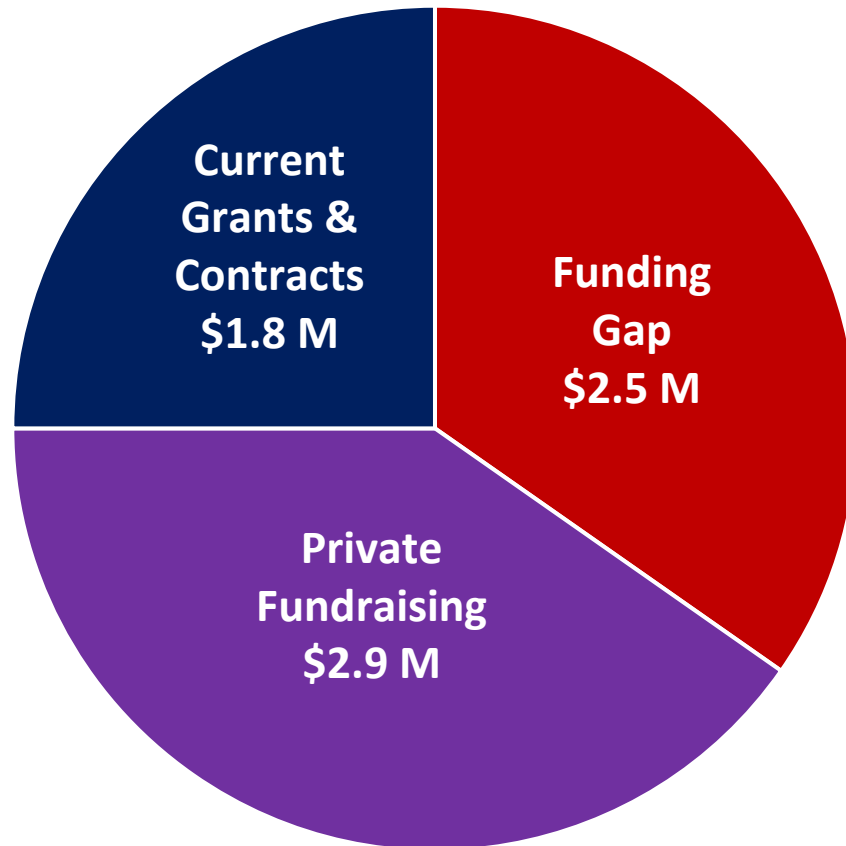
Needs are greater than before.



Survey at Dorothy Day Place revealed:

- 80% have a major disability.
- 2/3 have a serious mental illness.
- 28% have a serious substance use disorder.
