Mike L'Allier, retiree, passed away at age 82 on Feb. 1, 2024. He worked at the water utility from 1975 until 2004.





SPRWS seeks water utility workers, an inspector, & interns

The utility is seeking to hire numerous employees this spring.

Water utility worker I positions are open until March 21.

The position typically performs maintenance tasks on the water supply and distribution systems. Including the installation of water mains, hydrants, valves, and water services as part of a construction crew while gaining additional experience through our training program.

The utility is looking to hire a plumbing inspector. The position closes on March 25.

The viable candidate will have five years of experience as a State of Minnesota licensed journey level or master plumber.

Must possess and maintain:

- State of Minnesota Plumber License
- Journey or master level competency card issued by the City of Saint Paul
- Certificate of competency as a backflow tester
- A valid Minnesota class D driver's license or equivalent out of state driver's license

The utility is also looking for interns in several areas. Interns

are needed in water quality, engineering and marketing and public relations.

The water quality and engineering positions close on March 25, while the marketing and PR position closes on March 19.
