Dear Saint Paul neighbor:

Saint Paul Public Works is proposing minor changes to Residential Permit Parking Area 8. These changes need City Council approval.

Why is it happening?

To better serve nearby businesses during day time hours, Public Works is proposing changes to the parking restrictions in Residential Permit Parking Area 8. These changes would allow for short term customer parking during the day.

What and where are the proposed changes to Residential Permit Parking Area 8?

Time restrictions for permit parking on the west side of Asbury Street from Iglehart to the alley south of Concordia would be changed from a 24/7 "No Parking except by permit" restriction to a "No Parking 6 pm to 6 am except by permit" restriction. See map on back. This leaves the permit parking restriction in place for Allianz Field night games.

When will the City Council hear the Resolution?

The City Council will hear the Resolution on September 15, 2021.

Public attendance at the City Council's regular meeting location is not feasible due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Members of the public may view City Council meetings online at www.stpaul.legistar.com or on local cable Channel 18.

What will happen if the resolution passes?

If the City Council approves the changes to Residential Permit Parking Area 8, the signs on the west side of Asbury Street from Iglehart to the alley south of Concordia will be changed to "No Parking 6 pm to 6 am except by permit."
