**As owner or person(s) responsible for : 632 LEXINGTON PKWY N you are hereby ordered to eliminate all nuisance conditions which are in violation of Chapter 45 of Saint Paul Legislative Code.**

1. **IMMEDIATELY** secure all buildings which are open to unauthorized entry - 632/634 Lexington Pkwy N have re- entered the vacant building program per the City of St Paul Fire Inspection Department and must be vacated and secured. Comply before May 23, 2016

If you do not correct the nuisance or file an appeal **before May 23, 2016** , the City will correct the nuisance and charge all costs, including boarding costs, against the property as a special assessment to be collected in the same way as property taxes.

Charges: If the City corrects the nuisance, the charges will include the cost of correction, inspection, travel time, equipments, etc. The rate will be approximately \$260 per hour plus expensed for abatement.
