REGARDING: AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A HOME OWNERSHIP EDUCATION, COUNSELING AND TRAINING FUND GRANT FROM THE MINNESOTA HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY FOR THE MORTGAGE FORECLOSURE PREVENTION PROGRAM.

Requested Board Action

Authorization to accept a grant not to exceed \$17,000 from the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) to provide housing counseling services under the Home Ownership Education Counseling and Training (HECAT) Fund.

Background

Saint Paul's Department of Planning & Economic Development (PED) has been a HUD-approved Housing Counseling Agency for over 30 years and provides mortgage foreclosure counseling and financial budgeting counseling to Saint Paul residents.

Our foreclosure counselors provided mortgage foreclosure prevention counseling to the following number of households:

October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012	601
October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013	315
October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015	204 Note this was a two year contract
October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016	162
October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017	74

The \$17,000 cash grant from the MHFA HECAT is to help cover PED mortgage foreclosure counseling staff. This is outcome-based funding, meaning we receive 50% of the grant upon execution of the grant agreement. After mid-year analysis of performance is documented, the remaining 50% will be disbursed. The mid-year goal for households counseled is 25 and the annual goal is 50 households.

No budget amendment is required as the funding has been included in the 2018/2019 budget.
