

St. Paul City Ordinance allows ranked choice reallocation electronically only if the Ramsey County's voting system itself can perform the reallocation:




Minnesota Statute 206.56 defines a "voting system" as:

Subd. 8. **Electronic voting system.** "Electronic voting system" means a system in which the voter records votes by means of marking a ballot, so that votes may be counted by automatic tabulating equipment in the polling place where the ballot is cast or at a counting center.

An electronic voting system includes automatic tabulating equipment; nonelectronic ballot markers; electronic ballot markers, including electronic ballot display, audio ballot reader, and devices by which the voter will register the voter's voting intent; software used to program automatic tabulators and layout ballots; computer programs used to accumulate precinct results; ballots; secrecy folders; system documentation; and system testing results.

Municipalities may only use voting systems certified by the Minnesota Secretary of State. Ramsey County Elections performed the electronic reallocation with free, "federally tested" software from https://www.rcvresources.org/rctab. Presumably, the Elections Office

exported its voting system's "cast vote records" file and imported it into the RCTab program to determine the reallocation.



The November 4, 2025, mayoral election is the first time that the first-round leader did not win the most votes after reallocation. Performing a manual count and reallocation before the November 12, 2025, canvassing of returns will meet the requirements of city ordinance and ensure that the RCTab software performed properly.
