## NOTICE OF VIOLATION and NOTICE OF INTENT TO SUSPEND LICENSE

Edward Carlson Lucky Pizza's & Pasta's 1215 Randolph Avenue St. Paul, MN 55105

RE:

Restaurant (1) – No Seats license held by Lucky Pizza's & Pasta's LLC d/b/a Lucky Pizza's & Pasta's for the premises located at 1215 Randolph Avenue in Saint Paul. License ID #: 20080003151

Dear Mr. Carlson:

The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) has recommended adverse action against Restaurant (1)—No Seats license held by Lucky Pizza's & Pasta's LLC d/b/a Lucky Pizza's & Pasta's for the premises located at 1215 Randolph Avenue in Saint Paul. The basis for the recommendation is as follows:

On January 12, 2011, an inspector for the Department of Safety and Inspections came to your establishment for an Environmental Health Inspection. During that inspection, the inspector found cigarette butts and ashes in the food prep sink and ash trays full of cigarette butts in the employee area in the basement. The inspector also found SNUS stored in the food cooler.

This is a violation of Saint Paul Legislative Code § 238.04 (1) and (2) which state: "The proprietor or other person in charge of a bar or restaurant shall: 1) Post "no smoking" signs that comply with the Minnesota Clean Indoor Air Act Rules, Minnesota Rules part 4620.0500, as amended from time to time; 2) Ensure that ashtrays, lighters, and matchbooks are not provided in any area where smoking is prohibited..."

Saint Paul Legislative Code § 238.09 states: "Failure to comply with the requirement of Chapter 238 shall be a basis for adverse action (against any or all licenses or permits, licensee or applicant for a license) under Saint Paul Legislative Code § 310.06(b) (7) and shall be considered a violation of the provisions of the legislative code relating to the licensed activity under § 310.05 (m) (2) and shall be punishable accordingly under that section."

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> In addition to this violation, according to DSI records a delinquent invoice and letter were sent to you on December 30, 2010. The letter stated that your Restaurant (1) - No Seats license expired as of August 26, 2010 and you currently owe \$652.00 in delinquent license and late fees. You were given until January 20, 2011 to pay the delinquent license and late fees, but as of today's date they have not been paid.

As a result of the violation, per Saint Paul Legislative Code § 310.05(m) (2), the licensing office will recommend a \$500.00 matrix penalty and suspension of your Restaurant (1) - No Seats license until license and late fees are paid in full to the Department of Safety and Inspections.

At this time, you have three options on how to proceed:

- If you wish to admit to the violation you can pay the \$500.00 matrix penalty and the delinquent license and late fees of \$652.00. You can send the payments to the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) located at 375 Jackson Street, Ste. 220, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101-1806 no later than Tuesday, February 22, 2011. Information should be directed to the attention of Christine Rozek. A self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience. Payment of the \$500.00 matrix penalty and the delinquent license and late fees will be considered a waiver of the hearing to which you are entitled.
- If you wish to admit the facts but you contest the penalty, you may have a public hearing before the Saint Paul 2. City Council. You will need to send me a letter with a statement admitting to the facts and requesting a public hearing. I will need to receive your letter by Tuesday, February 22, 2011. The matter will then be scheduled before the City Council for a public hearing to determine whether to impose the \$500.00 matrix penalty and license suspension. You will have an opportunity to appear before the Council and make a statement on your own behalf.
- If you dispute the facts outlined above, you may request a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). 3. At that hearing both you and the City will appear and present witnesses, evidence and cross-examine each other's witnesses. After receipt of the ALJ's report (usually within 30 days), a public hearing will need to be scheduled. At that time, the City Council will decide whether to adopt, modify or reject the ALJ's report and recommendation. If this is your choice, please advise me no later than Tuesday, February 22, 2011, and I will take the necessary steps to schedule the administrative hearing.

If you have not contacted me by Tuesday, February 22, 2011, I will assume that you do not contest the imposition of the \$500.00 matrix penalty and license suspension. In that case, the matter will be placed on the City Council Consent Agenda for approval of the recommended penalty.
