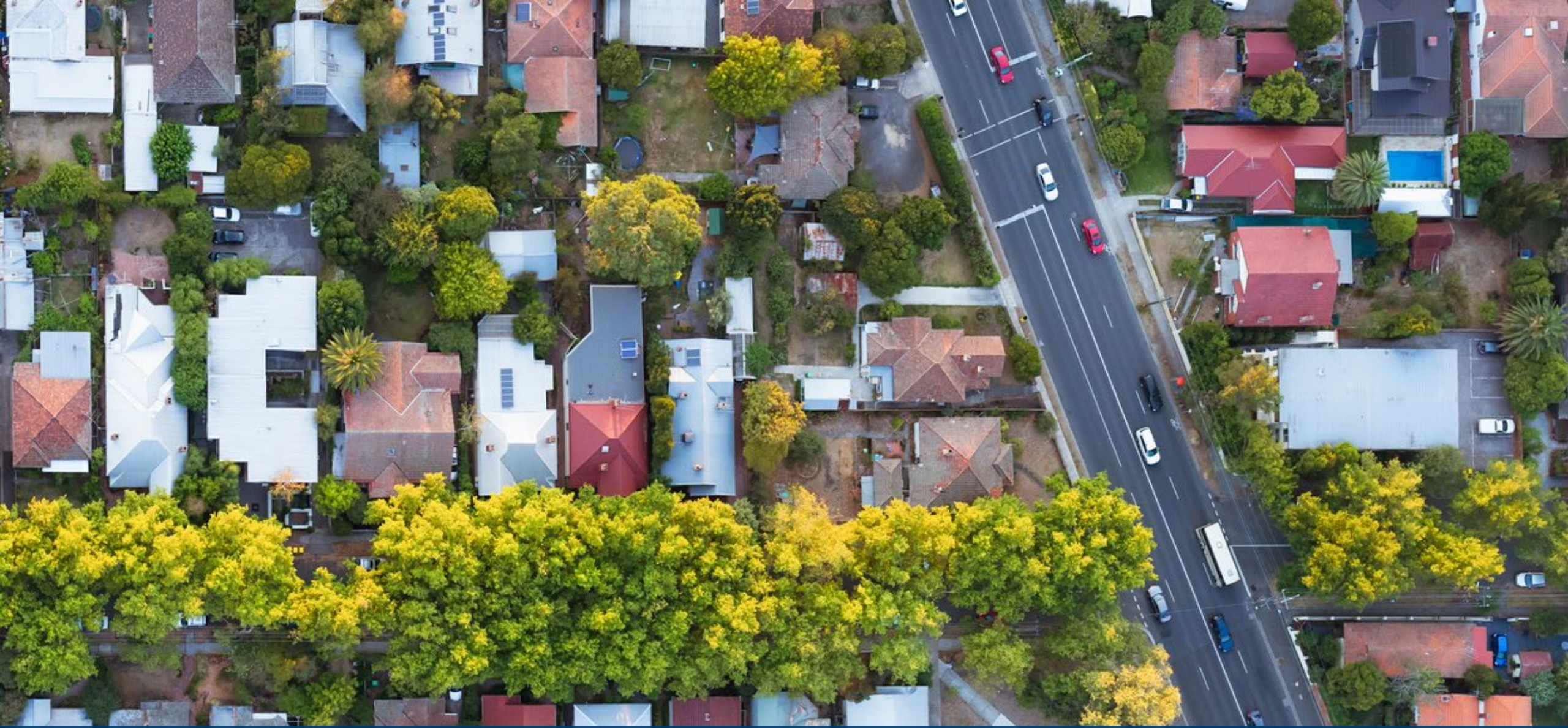




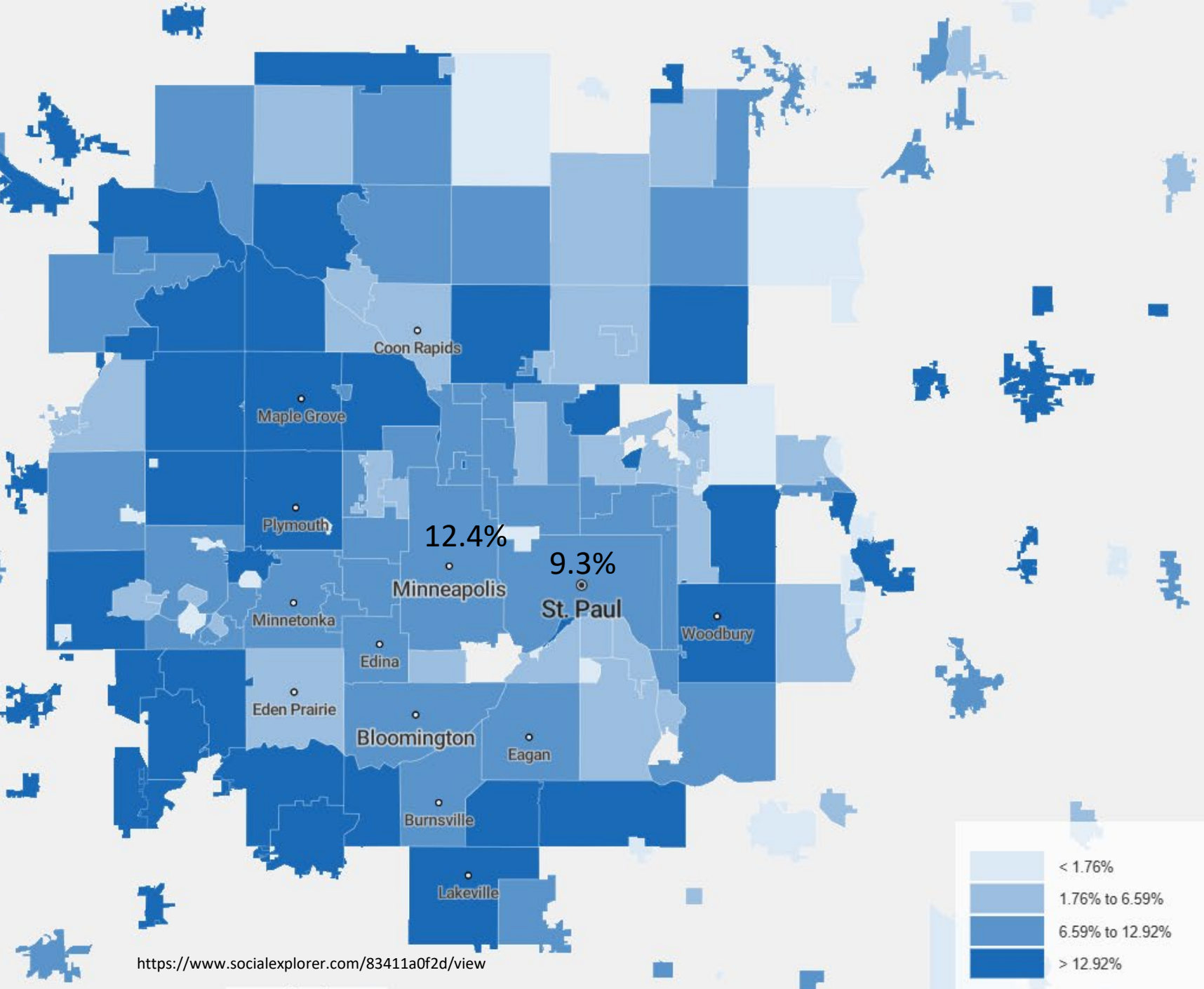

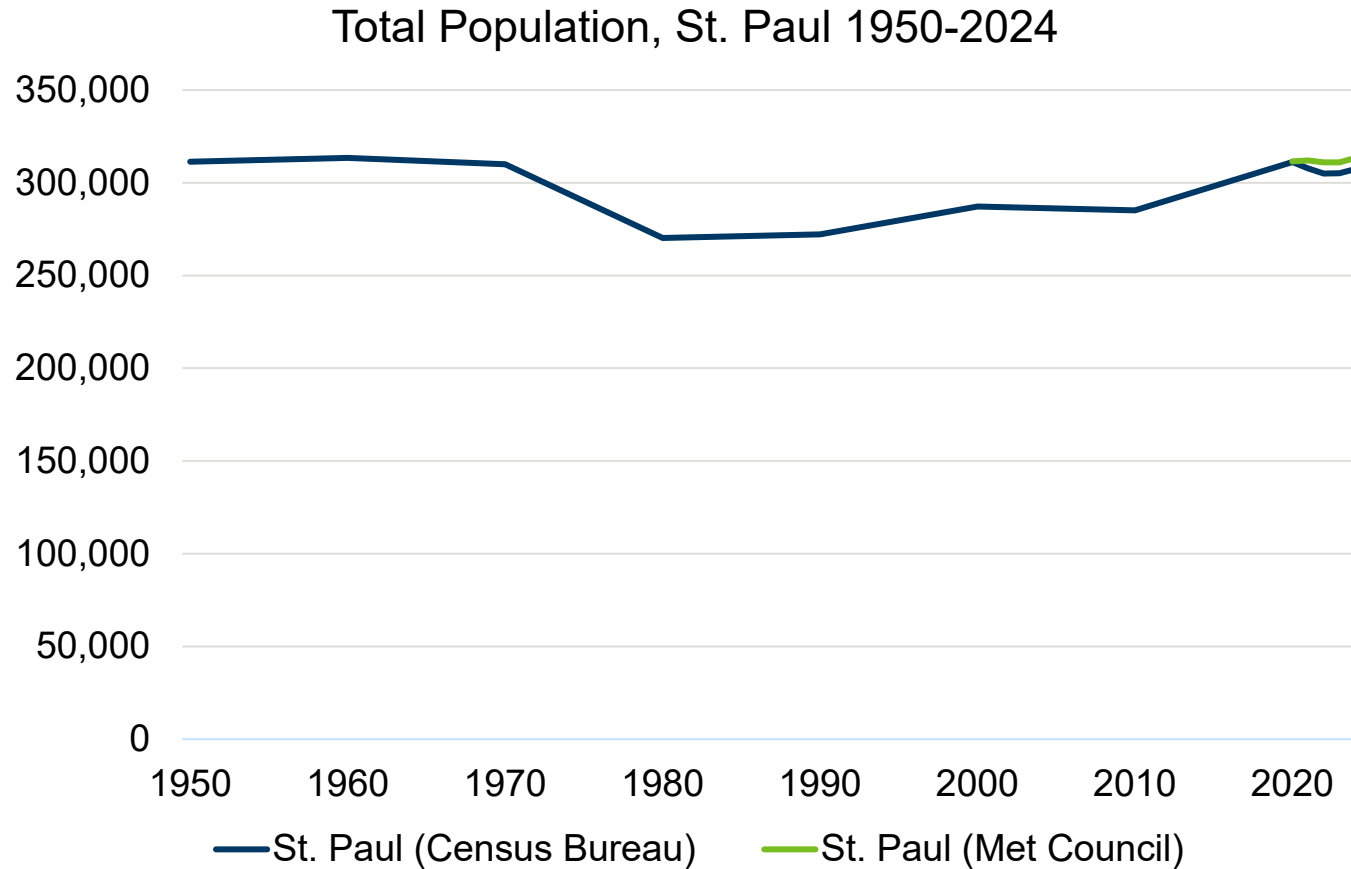
Population Growth

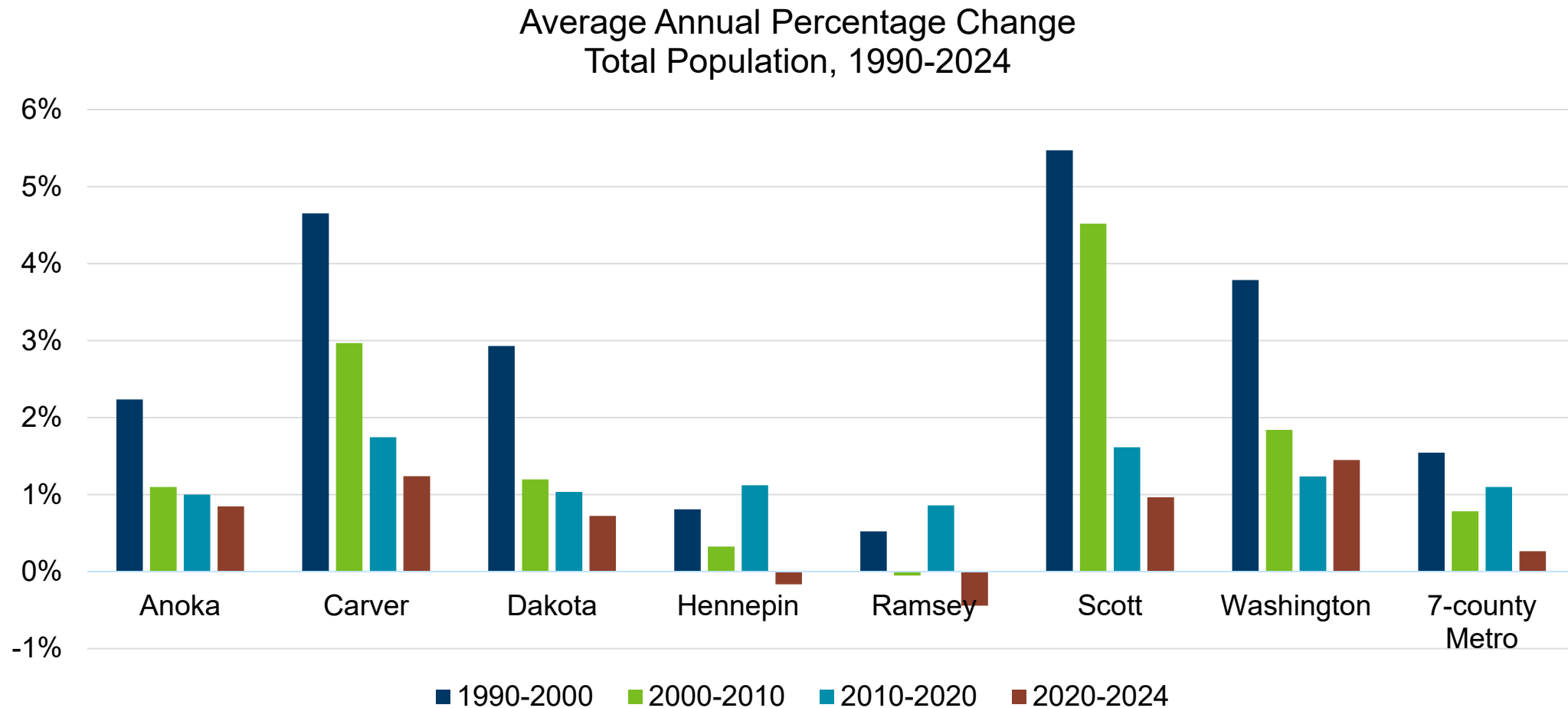
St. Paul: After a decade of population growth, a leveling off



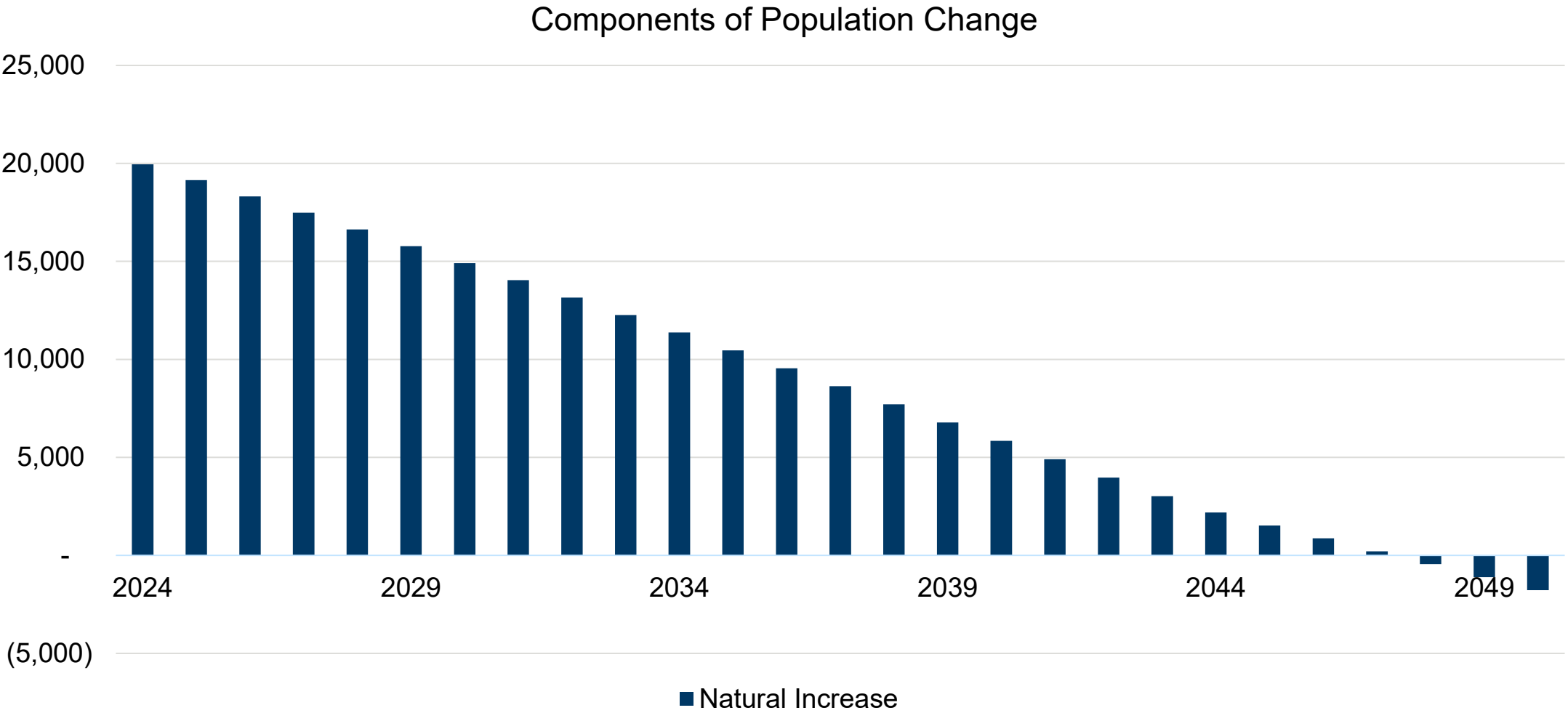
Total Population in 2024

The Census Bureau estimates that Ramsey County has lost population since 2020.



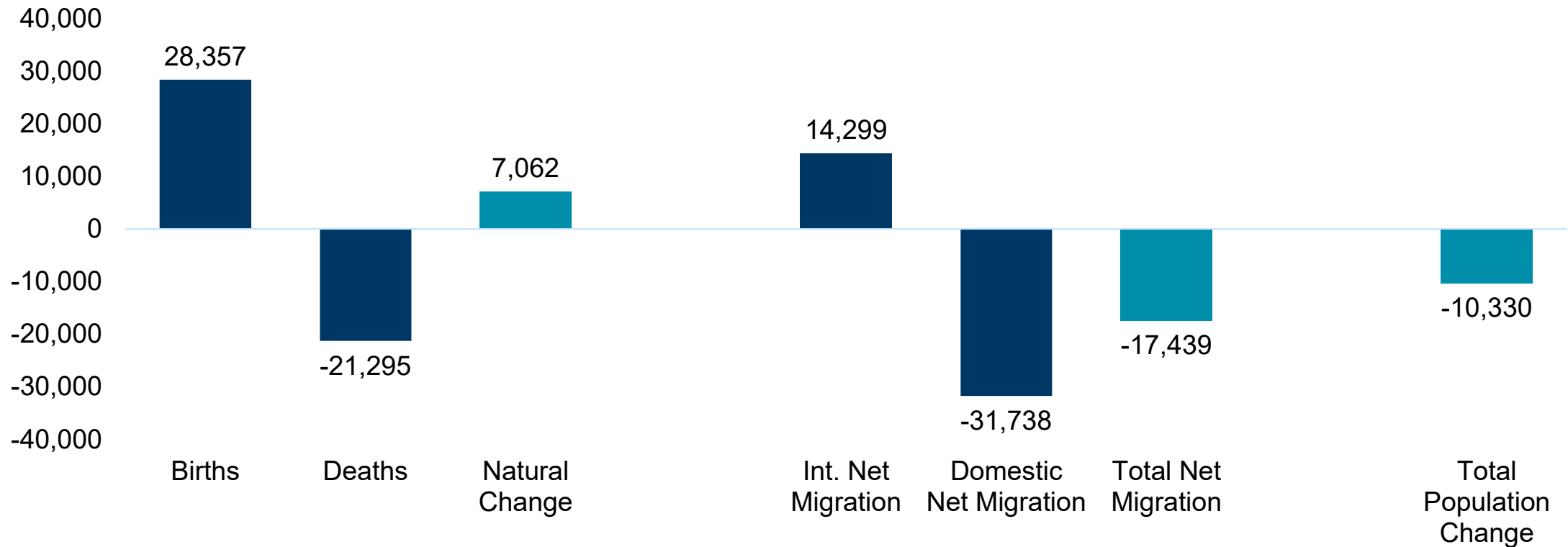
Minnesota's population will not grow from its own internal momentum in the future.

Lower birth rates and higher death rates are contributing to slower population growth.

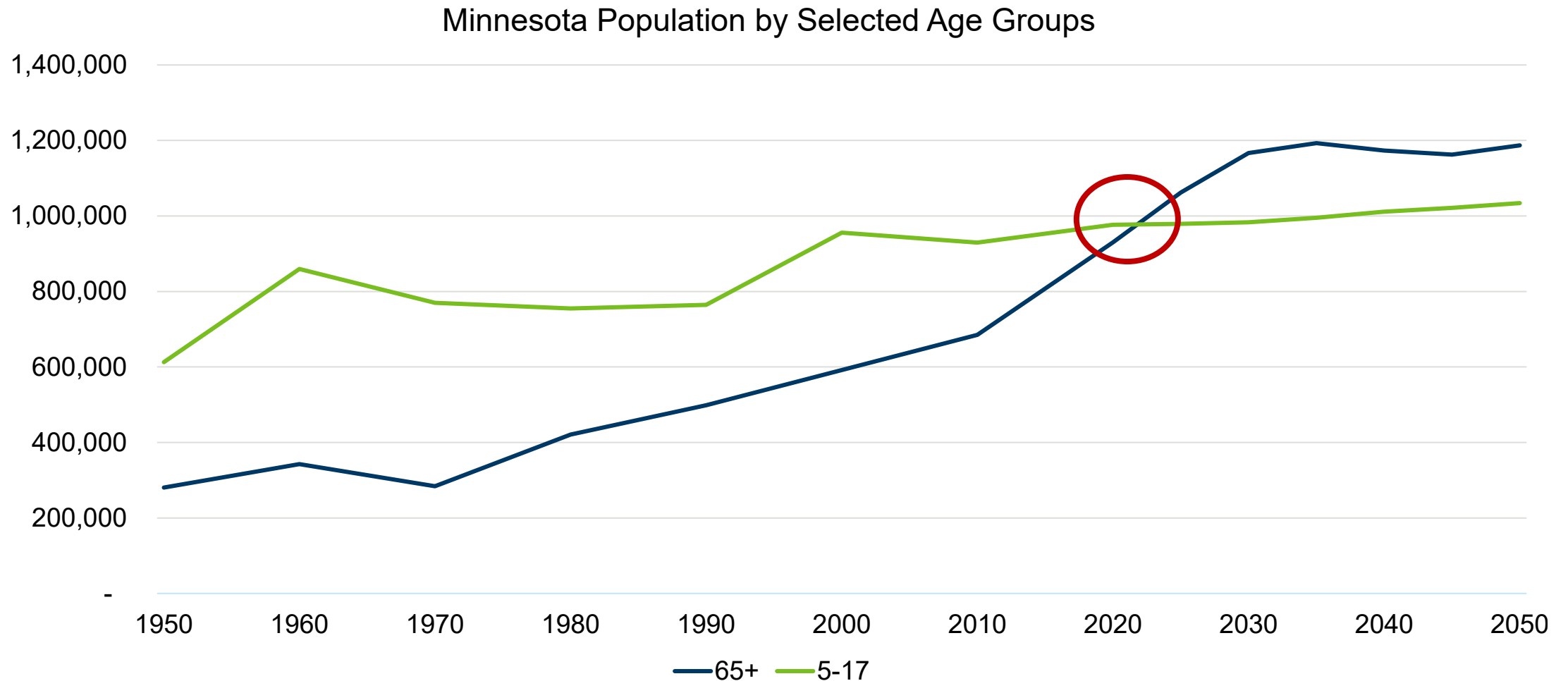

Components of Population Change





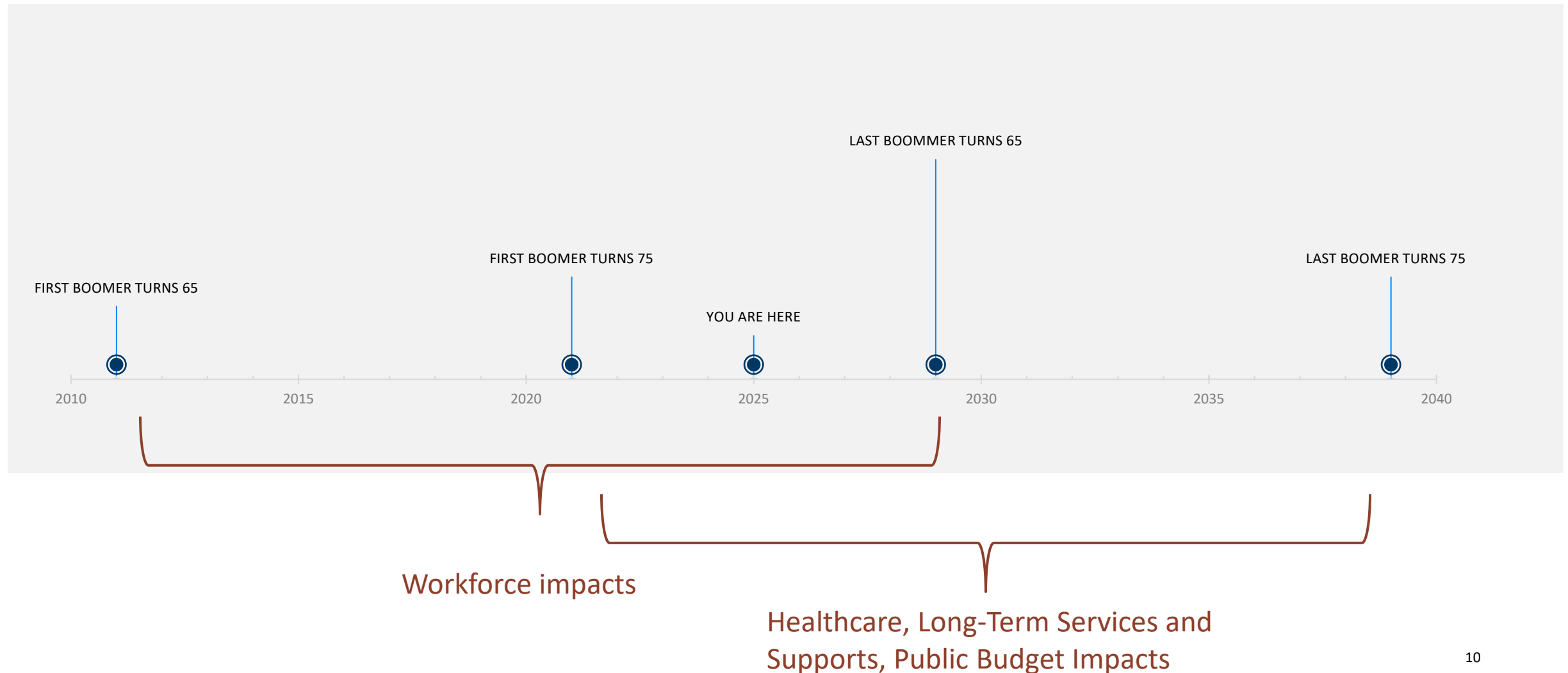
Population Aging

For the first time in Minnesota's history, there are more older adults than school-age children.

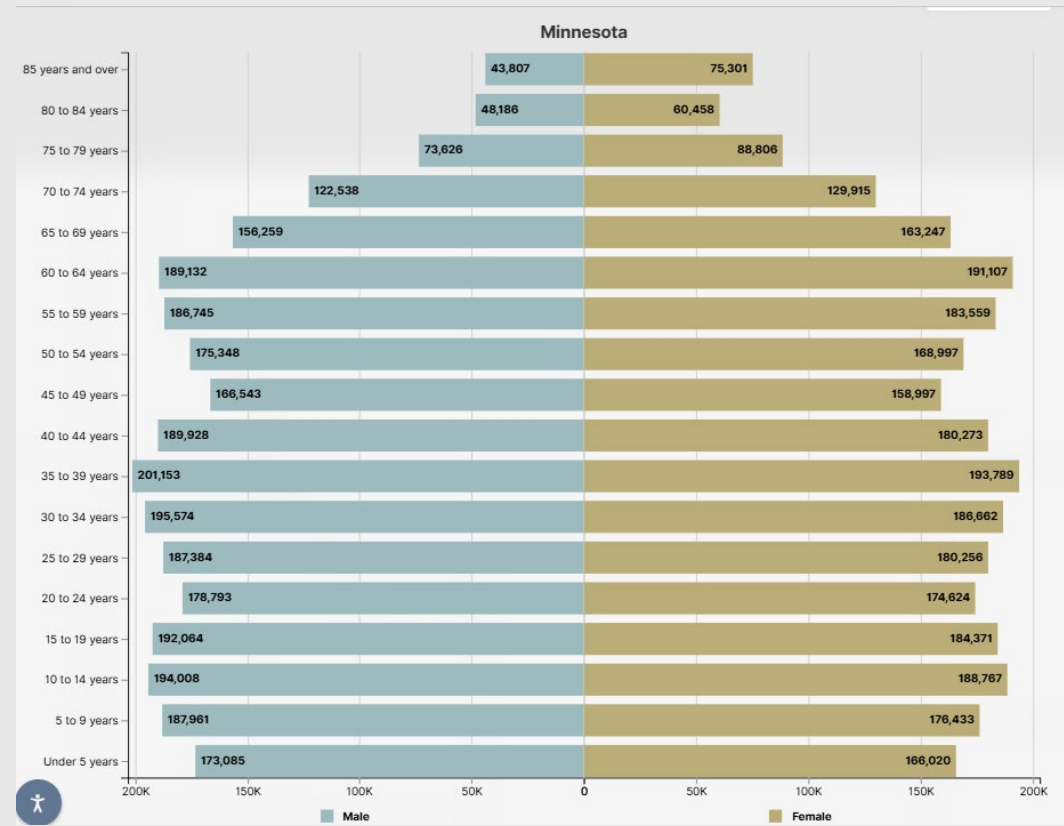
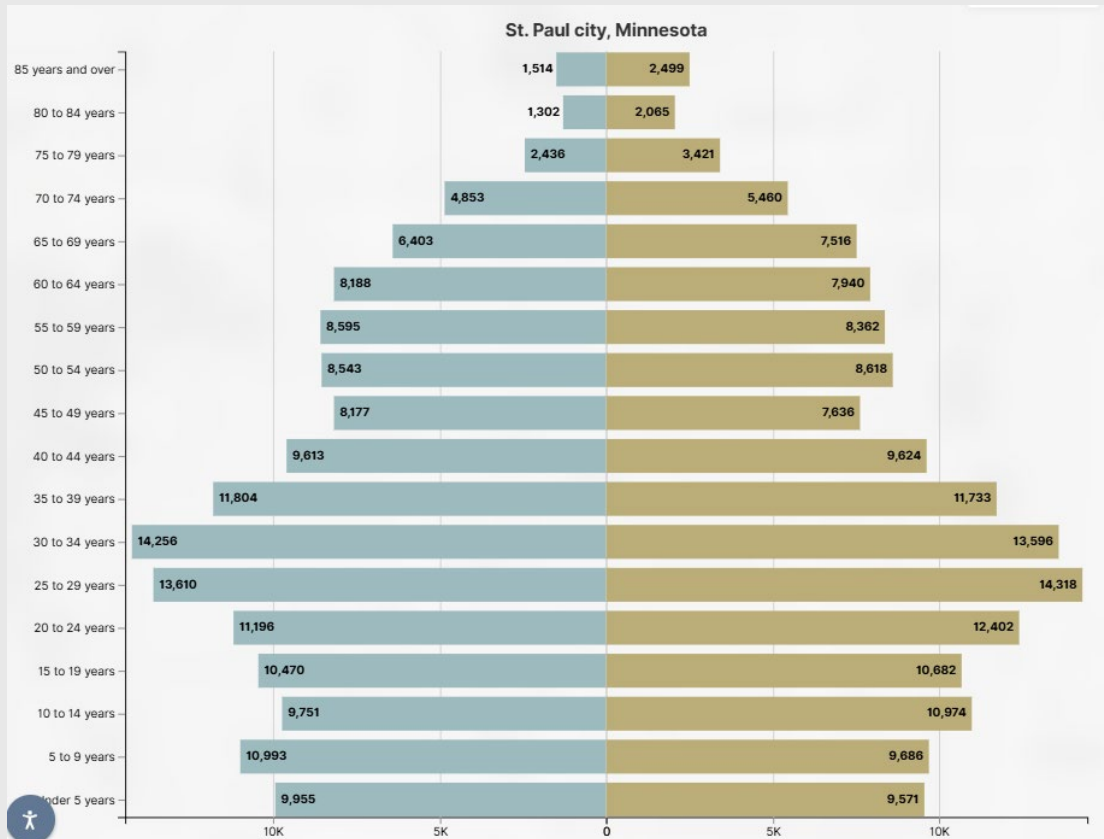

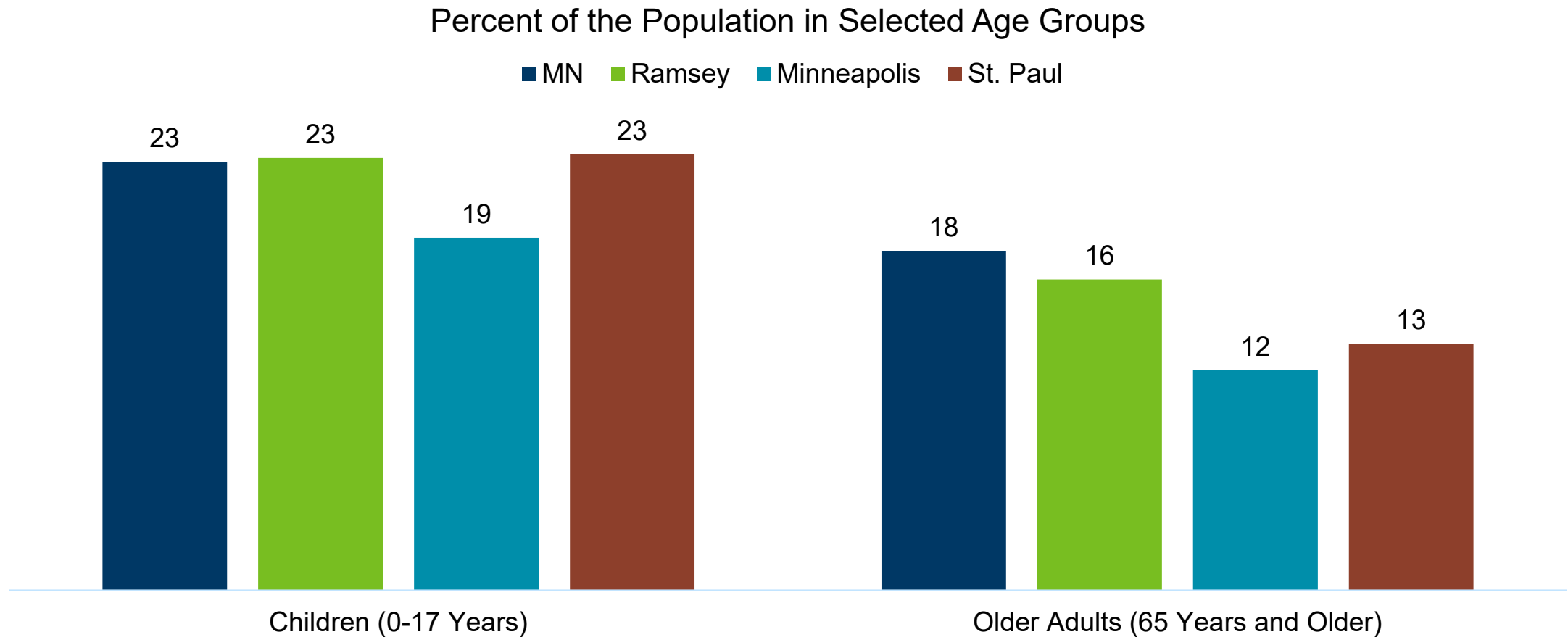

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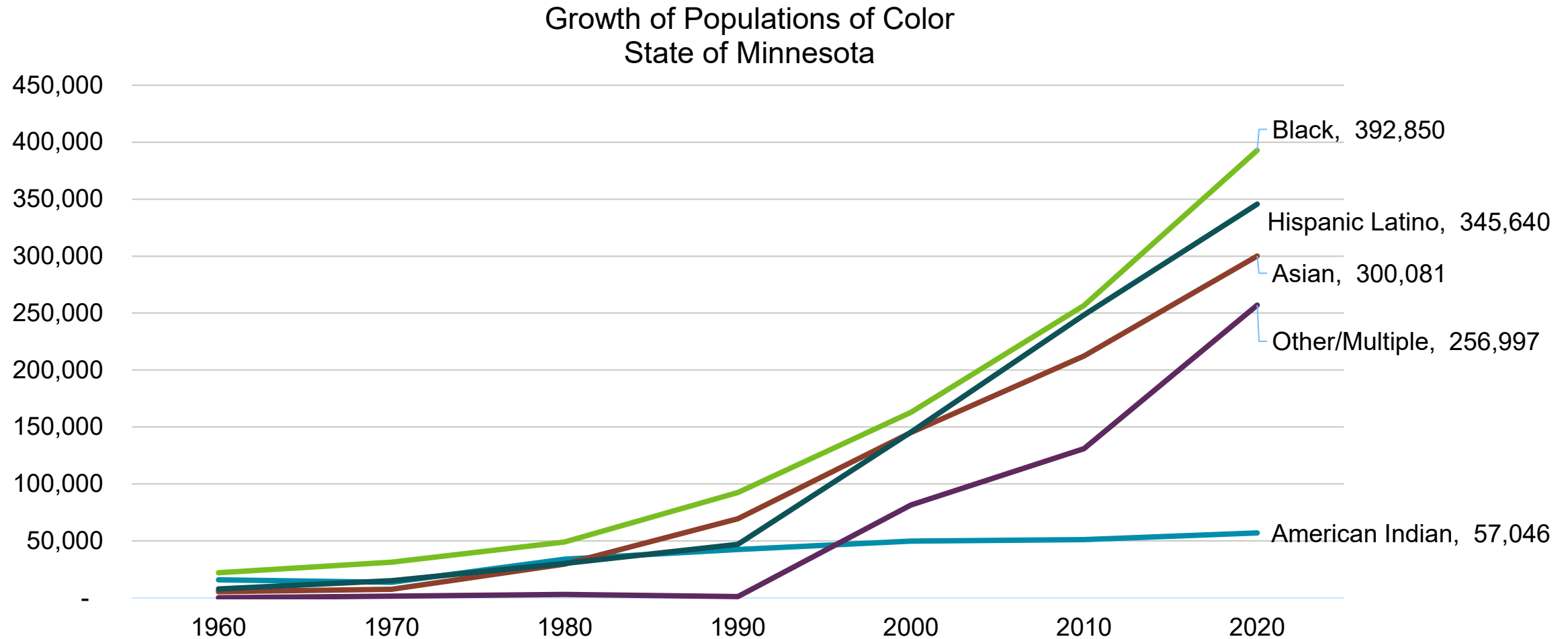
St. Paul has a larger share of children than Minneapolis; similar share of older adults.

BIPOC groups collectively total 1.3 million residents in Minnesota

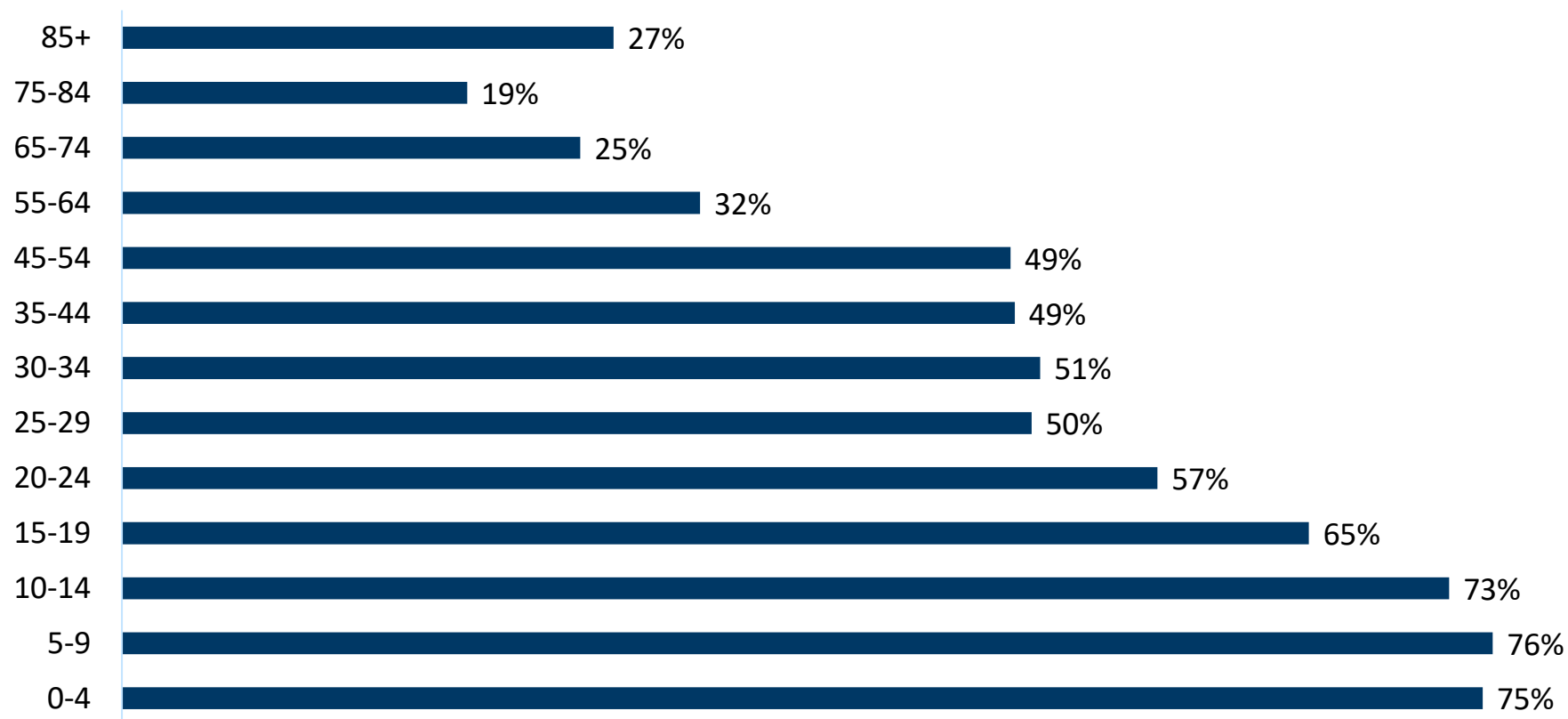

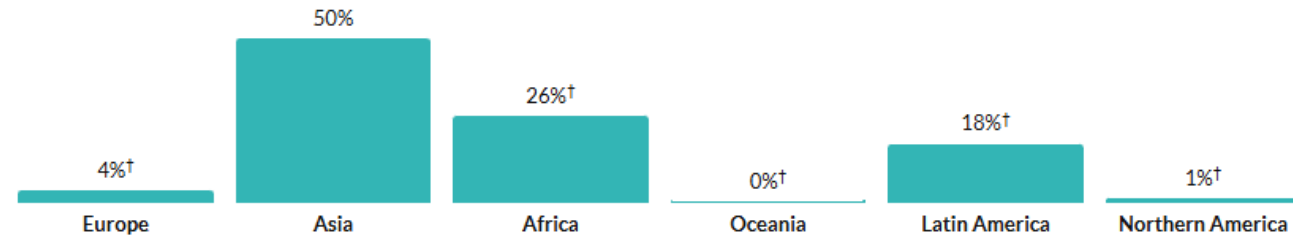

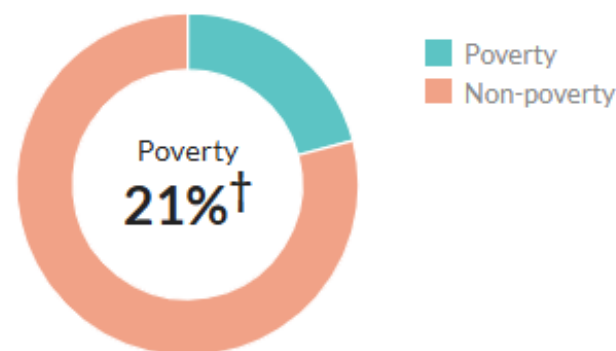

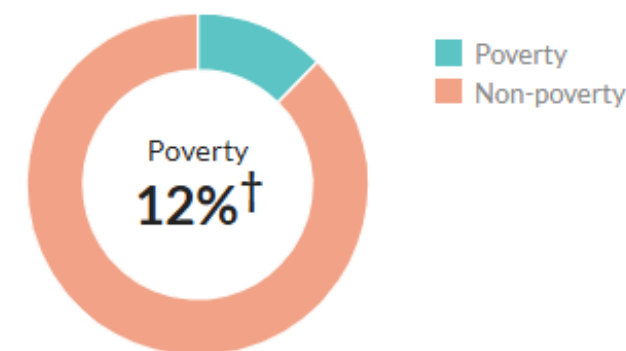

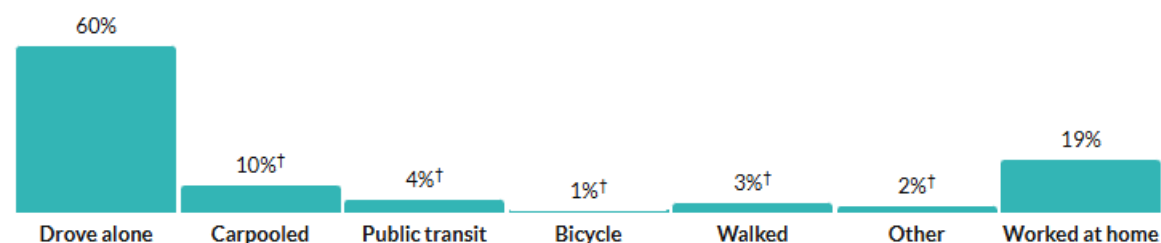

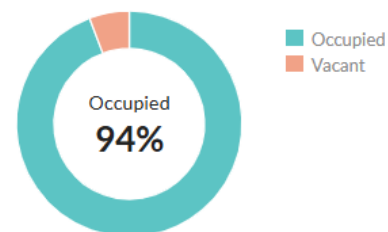

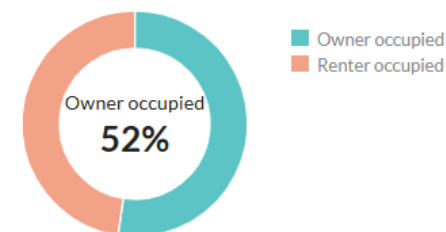

Occupied vs. Vacant



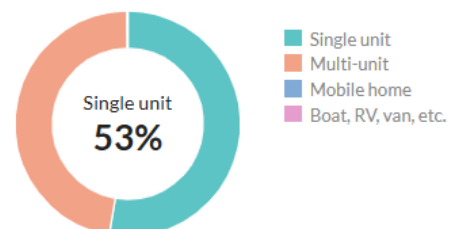
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Ownership of occupied units



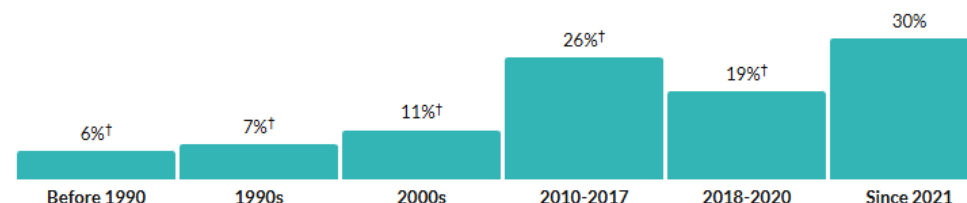
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Types of structure
