NOTICE OF VIOLATION

RE: All licenses held by Peter P. Ratsamy d/b/a 88 Oriental Foods for the premises located at 291 University Avenue West in Saint Paul
License ID #20050001541

Dear Mr. Ratsamy:

The Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) will recommend adverse action against all licenses held by Peter P. Ratsamy d/b/a 88 Oriental Foods for the premises located at 291 University Avenue West in Saint Paul. The basis for the recommendation is as follows:

On July 29, 2011, the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) - Environmental Health Division conducted an inspection of your establishment and cited you for one (1) CRITICAL-MINOR and two (2) CRITICAL-MAJOR Environmental Health Code violations one of which was: Potentially hazardous hot foods not being maintained at proper temperatures (*in the steam table: quail 120°F, BBQ Pork 98°F, Hmong egg rolls 122°F and fish 108°F*).

On August 5, 2011, you were sent a Notice of New Critical Violations listing these violations and stating that they needed to be corrected. You were then informed that a re-inspection would take place on or after August 28, 2011.

On September 12, 2011, the Environmental Health Division of DSI conducted a re-inspection of your establishment and cited you for same CRITICAL – MAJOR Environmental Health Code violation that had not been corrected by the August 28, 2011, deadline: Potentially hazardous hot foods not being maintained at proper temperatures (*in the steam table: quail 120°F, BBQ Pork 98°F, Hmong egg rolls 122°F and fish 108°F*).

This is a violation of Minnesota Administrative Rules part 4626.0395: “Maintain all hot, potentially hazardous foods at 140 degrees Fahrenheit or above to prevent bacterial growth and/or toxin production....”

As a result, per Saint Paul Legislative Code §310.05 (m) (9), the licensing office will recommend a \$250.00 matrix penalty and suspension of your licenses until the violation is corrected.

At this time, you have three options on how to proceed:

1. If you wish to admit to the violation and you do not contest the penalty you need to do two things:
 - 1) Pay the \$250.00 matrix penalty. You can send the payment to the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) located at 375 Jackson Street, Ste. 220, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101-1806 no later than **Monday, October 10, 2011**. A self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience.
 - 2) You also need to contact Abdinasir Museid, R.S. Environmental Health Specialist at (651) 266-9141 by **Monday, October 10, 2011**, to schedule a re-inspection in order to verify that the violation has been corrected. Payment of the \$250.00 matrix penalty and correction of the violation will be considered a waiver of the hearing to which you are entitled.
2. If you wish to admit the facts but you contest the penalty, you may have a public hearing before the Saint Paul City Council. You will need to send me a letter with a statement admitting to the facts and requesting a public hearing. I will need to receive your letter by **Monday, October 10, 2011**. The matter will then be scheduled before the City Council for a public hearing to determine whether to impose the \$250.00 matrix penalty and license suspensions. You will have an opportunity to appear before the Council and make a statement on your own behalf.
3. If you dispute the facts outlined above, you may request a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). You will need to send me a letter disputing the facts and requesting an administrative hearing by **Monday, October 10, 2011**. At that hearing both you and the City will appear and present witnesses, evidence and cross-examine each other's witnesses. After receipt of the ALJ's report (usually within 30 days), a public hearing will need to be scheduled. At that time, the City Council will decide whether to adopt, modify or reject the ALJ's report and recommendation.

If you have not contacted me or the Environmental Health Specialist by Monday, October 10, 2011, I will assume that you are not contesting the imposition of the \$250.00 matrix penalty and license suspensions. In that case, the matter will be placed on the City Council Consent Agenda for approval of the recommended penalty.
