

## St. Paul Regional Water Services Vehicle Accident Summary

2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter April/May/June 2020

**SPRWSVA 2020-03 Business Meter Reading 04/07/2020 11:00 A.M:** SPRWS meter reader was driving Vehicle #649 (Ford Escape) NB on Western and while turning left – turned too sharply and struck a street sign on the median (divided road sign) and caused minor to moderate scraping damage to the left front end and undercarriage of #649. We are working with the Meter Supervisors and employee to gather more complete information.

**SPRWSVA 2020-04 Distribution 04/24/2020 2:45 P.M:** SPRWS Turn-On truck #555 was WB on Larpenteur at Jackson when Vehicle #2 (Toyota RAV 4) that was EB on Larpenteur turned Left/NB onto Jackson in front of #555 and caused the two vehicles to collide. Vehicle #2 failed to yield the right-of-way, causing the accident. American Family insurance accepted responsibility for the accident after reviewing the police report.

**SPRWSVA 2020-05 Vadnais 05/28/2020 7:45 A.M.:** Vadnais Laborer, driving truck #615 (4-door F-350) was SB on Edgerton and stopped at the intersection of County Road B. As #615 continued SB he stopped quickly when he noticed vehicle #2 (Ford Ranger) driving EB on County Road B in the WB lane. Vehicle #2 ran the stop sign at Edgerton and struck the front end of #615 in a hard-glancing blow and continued across Edgerton, through a barricade and struck and came to rest against a Q3 Construction Skid-steer. There were no injuries to the SPRWS driver/passenger or Q3 employees, while the driver of vehicle #2 was taken to the hospital by Maplewood EMS. Damage repairs were the responsibility of the vehicle #2.

**SPRWSVA 2020-06 Distribution Division 06/20/2020 10:45 A.M.:** SPRWS Turn-On truck #555 was parked in a U of M parking lot near Dudley & Cleveland along with a Vadnais security vehicle. Upon leaving the parking space, the employee forgot that he was parked next to a light pole marker and as he turned out, struck and damaged the rear portion of the left door and left trucks box. No injuries reported.
