Drinking Water Week activities to be held May 7 - 9

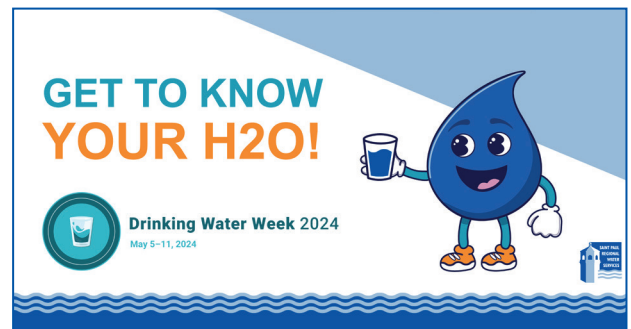
National Drinking Water Week is May 5 -11 and the utility will be celebrating with a variety of activities.
