Program Summary

AmeriCorps will conduct a series of engagement, trust building, and knowledge sharing activities between the police and the community. The AmeriCorps members will strengthen police and community relations within racially diverse and challenged neighborhoods, make 20,000 connections in the community, and increase the community understanding of the American legal system. AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 50 volunteers, who will be engaged in expanding access to engagement activities through Police Athletic League events and assisting with education campaigns within their own communities.

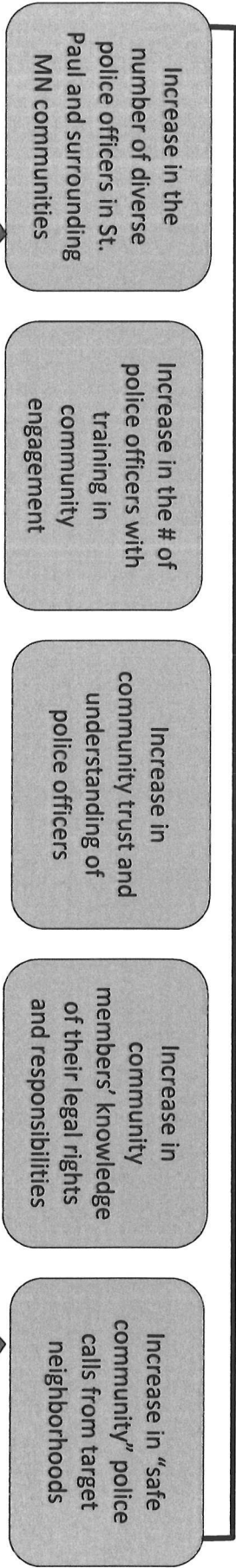

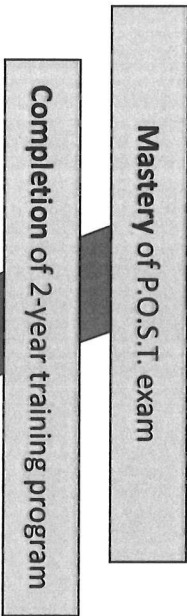
