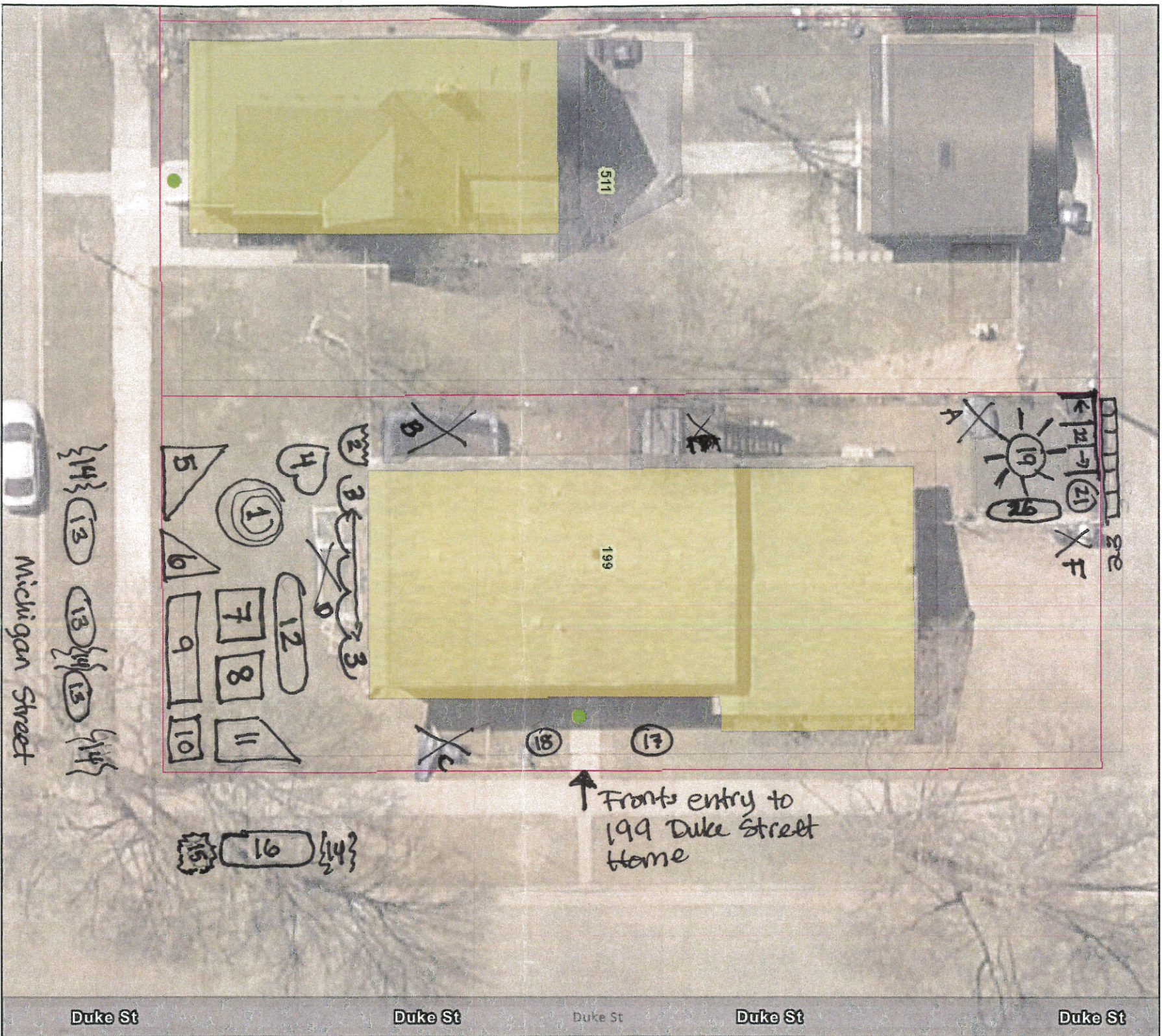

Planting beds listed in order of creation or restructuring.

1. Permaculture spiral: herb & vegetable mound.
2. Sweet pea, cucumber & radish climb fence.
3. Half moon: tall perennial pollinator flower beds.
4. Heart shapes shallot, swiss chard, collard bed.
5. Triangle: onion, turnip, dinosaur kale & beet bed.
6. Triangle: Russian kale, beet & shasta daisy bed.
7. Peppa Ed's bed frame okra, oregano, roma tomato & Serrano pepper bed.
8. Peppa Ed's bed frame: cherry tomato, (Scout?) jalapeño & parsley bed.
9. Rectangle: lettuce, mixed greens, bokchoi, carrot, tomatillo, bed.
10. Square corner: low growing acorn squash bed.
11. Trapezoid: low profile green bean bed.
12. Oval: summer squash, kolortabi, basil, boreccoli.
13. Low lie: strawberry & canteloupe beds.
14. Pollinator patches of wildflowers year one.
15. Tree stump: butternut squash, mind & tomatoes.
16. Rectangle: chives, onions, sage, milkweed and Minnesota native wildflowers.
17. Elderberry
18. Forsythia
19. 3 Sisters native corn, bean & pumpkin sun ray bed.
20. Cucumber & bean climb fence.
21. Sun flowers to pollinate
22. Composting
23. Anise hyssop, green onions, rhubarb & chives.
