All wood exterior unprotected surfaces must be painted or protected from the elements and maintained in a professional manner free from chipped or peeling paint. -Scrap and paint as needed

- 3. Garage MSFC 304.3.3 Relocate dumpster at least 5 feet away from combustible walls, openings, or combustible eaves and overhangs.
- 4. Garage SPLC 34.08(5), 34.32(3) All accessory structures including, but not limited to, detached garages, sheds and fences shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair. Provide and maintain exterior unprotected surfaces painted or protected from the elements. -Scrap and paint garage.
- 5. Rear stairway second floor SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window glass.
- 6. Second floor Bathroom MSFC 605.1- All light fixtures shall be maintained with protective globes if originally equipped.
- 7. Unit 2 MSFC 703 Provide, repair or replace the fire rated door and assembly. The minimum rating must be: 20 minutes. -Repair and maintain the door closer.
- 8. Unit doors SPLC 71.01 Provide address numbers on building per attached HN-1 handout.
- 9. MSFC 906.1, MN Stat. 299F.361 Provide approved fire extinguishers in accordance with the following types, sizes and locations. -Provide minimum 2A10BC fire extinguishers spaced not more than 75 feet travel distance from any point in the building to an extinguisher. They must be permanently mounted between 3 and 5 feet high in readily visible and easily accessible locations.
