### Winter is plant maintenance time as flocs and clarifiers get clean out/repairs



Winter is maintenance season in the treatment plant. Above, floc 3 stands empty on Feb. 22. Notice the new shaft on the paddle on the upper part of the image, where the cross beams have not yet been replaced. In the winter months, we clean out and make any repairs



to the paddles, drive shaft, chains or other parts in preparation for the upcoming production year. Flocs 1 and 2 were emptied and cleaned out in November and December. The round clarifiers are also empty and being cleaned out this month. Clarifier 1 is pictured above.
