Minnesota Statutes Chapter 443 require the city to issue the original invoice, to deposit all funds in a separate account and to pay all related expenses, including contracted work, from that fund. "443.33 RUBBISH DISPOSAL FUND. Rates charged and collected, including compensation for work under contract, shall be deposited in a fund separate and distinct from any and all other city funds, to be designated "Rubbish Disposal Fund", which shall be a continuing fund to which shall be credited all receipts, and to which shall be charged all costs, principal or current, incident to such activity." 2) The first invoices were due by Oct. 4, 2018.
