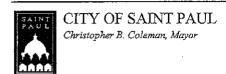

VACANT BUILDING REGISTRATION NOTICE

The premises at 594 CASE AVE

has been inspected and found to meet the legal definition of a Vacant Building as described in Saint Paul Legislative Code, Chapter 43. You are required to register this building with the Department of Safety and Inspections, Vacant Buildings Division, by filling out and returning the registration form provided with this letter. You are also required to pay the annual Vacant Building Registration Fee o: \$1,440.00 The fee is due upon receipt of this letter and must be paid no later than thirty (30) days from the date of this letter, as required in Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43. If this building is vacant due to a fire, complete the enclosed registration form and return it to this office within 30 days.

Please return the enclosed registration form along with your payment by August 24, 2014.

You may file an appeal to this fee or registration requirements by contacting the Office of the City Clerk at (651) 266-8688. Any appeal of this fee must be made within ten (10) days of the date of this notice.

If the registration fee is not received in this office within 45 days of the date of this letter the full amount owed will be assessed to, and collected with, the taxes for this property as permitted by Saint Paul Legislative Code Chapter 43.

The Code Enforcement Officer has notified the Building Inspection And Design Section that this property meets the legal definition of a registered vacant building and in accordance with Legislative Code Chapter 33, no permits (except demolition, wrecking and removal permits) will be issued until the requirements of all applicable ordinances are fulfilled.

All category 2 and category 3 vacant buildings must be winterized with gas and water services shut off or, alternately, an excess flow gas valve must be installed in the dwelling, within sixty (60) days of the date of this Notice.

WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL IS REQUIRED BEFORE A CATEGORY 2 OR CATEGORY 3 VACANT BUILDING CAN BE OCCUPIED OR SOLD.

- Category 2: Requirements include: 1. register/re-register the building, 2. pay outstanding fee(s), 3. obtain a code compliance report, 4. submit for approval a rehab cost estimate from a licensed contractor and a schedule for completion of all code compliance work, 5. submit proof of financial responsibility acceptable to the City, and 6. obtain Zoning approval of the proposed use.
- Category 3: All requirements listed for Category 2 vacant buildings, AND obtain a Certificate of Occupancy OR Certificate of Code Compliance prior to the sale of the building.

If the use of this building meets the definition of a nonconforming use by the Zoning Code then the use will lose its nonconforming status 365 days from the date the building was declared vacant.

You must contact the Enforcement officer, Tom Friel, at 651-266-1906 to find out what must be done before this building can be legally reoccupied.

The Enforcement Officer may declare this building(s) to constitute a Nuisance Building subject to demolition and issue an Order to Abate under authority of Legislative Code Chapter 45. In the event this building is declared a Nuisance Building subject to demolition, the Enforcement Officer will notify all owners and interested parties of the Order to Abate, as provided in the Legislative Code Chapter 45.

Revocation of Fire Certificate of Occupancy

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on July 1, 2014, for the renewal of the Fire Certificate of occupancy. Since you have failed to comply with the applicable requirements, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy in accordance with Section 401.06 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code.

Saint Paul Legislative Code provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- 1. Both units kitchen range SPLC 34.12 (2), SPLC 34.36 (1) Repair and maintain all required and supplied equipment in an operative and safe condition to properly and safely perform their intended function in accordance with the provisions of the applicable code.
- 2. Exterior SPLC 34.08 (1), 34.31 (1) All exterior property areas shall be maintained free from any accumulation of refuse, garbage or feces.
- Exterior SPLC 34.11 (7), 34.34 (4) Provide additional approved containers or additional pick-ups to meet tenant trash demands.
- 4. Exterior SPLC 45.03 (6) Cut and maintain the grass/weeds less than 8 inches tall.
- 5. Exterior rear Receptacle MSFC 605.1 Repair or replace damaged electrical fixtures. This work will require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989.
- 6. Multiple locations SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window glass.

- 7. Multiple locations SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.34 (6) Repair and maintain the walls in an approved manner. -Patch the holes and/or cracks in the walls and ceilings. Paint the walls and ceilings.
- 8. Multiple locations SPLC 34.10 (7), 34.34 (6) Repair and maintain the floor in an approved manner.-Repair or replace the carpeting and/or tile.
- 9. Multiple locations SPLC 34.09 (3), 34.32 (3) Repair and maintain the window in good condition.-numerous issues including: rotten wood, don't fit well in framing, screwed shut, don't lock, paint peeling, large air gaps, missing glass, and missing or torn screens.
- 10. Unit 1 Kitchen counter and backsplash SPLC 34.12 (2), SPLC 34.36 (1) Repair and maintain all required and supplied equipment in an operative and safe condition to properly and safely perform their intended function in accordance with the provisions of the applicable code. -Broken tiles, missing grout and caulk.
- 11. Unit 2 Rear stairway SPLC 34.10 (3), 34.33(2) Repair or replace the unsafe stairway in an approved manner.-Step broken
- 12. SPLC 34.09 (1) b,c, 34.33 (1) b, c Provide and maintain all exterior walls free from holes and deterioration. All wood exterior unprotected surfaces must be painted or protected from the elements and maintained in a professional manner free from chipped or peeling paint.
- 13. SPLC 34.08 (3) Provide and maintain suitable ground cover on all exterior areas to control erosion.
- 14. SPLC 34.08 (10) Repair, replace and maintain exterior sidewalks, walkways and stairs.
- 15. SPLC 34.08 (2) Provide and maintain the property grade to slope away from the building to minimize the accumulation of water near the building. This work may require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-9090.
- 16. SPLC 34.08 (7) All parking spaces shall be paved with asphalt, concrete, or durable dustless surfacing. Before any existing spaces may be paved, site plan approval must be obtained as specified in the St. Paul Zoning Code. Contact DSI Zoning at 651-266-9090.
- 17. SPLC 34.11 (6), 34.34 (3) Provide service of heating facility by a licensed contractor which must include a carbon monoxide test. Submit a completed copy of the Saint Paul Fire Marshal's Existing Fuel Burning Equipment Safety Test Report to this office.
- 18. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
