NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
Sound Level Variance – Mears Park
St. Paul Downtown Criterium

TO: CapitolRiver Council District 17

This is to inform you of a request for a variance from the sound level limitations as indicated in the St. Paul Noise Ordinance (Chapter 293 of the St. Paul Legislative Code). Property owned by you and located near the noise source, may be affected by this variance request. Rental property owners must provide a copy of this notice to all renters or post a copy in a common area of the building so it can be viewed by the occupants.

Description of Variance:

Location: Mears Park

Noise Source: Minnesota Bicycle Festivals Inc. has requested a sound level variance, in order to present amplified music and announcements located near the corner of 6th Street and Sibley Street, for the St. Paul Downtown Criterium on Wednesday, June 15, 2016 from 4:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., with a pre-event sound check at 3:00 p.m. The Department of Safety and Inspections will be recommending the following: 1) Variance will be for the St. Paul Downtown Criterium located near the corner of 6th Street and Sibley Street on June 15, 2016. 2) All electronically powered equipment, PA system, loudspeaker or any similar device used in conjunction with the event, will not exceed 85 dBA, as measured 50 feet from any stage or sound source. 3) The applicant shall provide personnel and equipment to ensure compliance with the variance conditions. 4) All electronically powered equipment, PA systems, loudspeakers or similar devices will be turned off by 9:30 p.m. on June 15, 2016. Recommended conditions may change before the date of the public hearing.
