NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Saint Paul, Minnesota (the “City”) will meet via electronic means on **Wednesday, November 3, 2021 at 3:30pm** or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing regarding the award of a Business Subsidy under the **27th** Cycle Neighborhood STAR Program to:

A summary of the proposed terms of the Business Subsidy is available for inspection on file and available in electronic form through an emailed request to Annie Byrne at the Department of Planning and Economic Development at annie.byrne@ci.stpaul.mn.us on or before the date of the hearing, during normal business hours.

The Mayor has determined, due to the emergency declared under Minn. Stat. Chapter 12 by the Governor of Minnesota and the Mayor regarding the COVID-19 health pandemic, that it is not practical nor prudent for the City Council to meet in-person or pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 13D.02. In light of the COVID-19 health pandemic, it is not feasible for all members of City Council to be present at the regular location, and some or all of the members of the City Council will attend this meeting by telephone or other electronic means.

It is also not feasible for members of the public to attend the meeting at its regular location due to the health pandemic and emergency. Accordingly, no meeting will be held in Council Chambers at 15 W. Kellogg Boulevard in the City of Saint Paul.

No action may be filed against the City for the failure to comply with Minnesota Statutes Sections 116J.993 to 116J.995 unless a written complaint is filed.
