

Shop with Cops started in 2000 as an initiative from the SPPD West District and our community partners. The purpose of the event is to foster positive relationships between youth and officers. Young kids, K - 6th grade are selected each year during the end-of-the-year holiday season to shop at one of the local area stores to purchase gifts for members of their immediate family. Each child is given a small amount of money to spend, normally \$50-\$100 depending on the size of the child's immediate family. Approximately 1-2 children are assigned to each police officer, who then escorts them around the store and assists in selecting appropriate gifts for each family member. The children understand that the money is not for personal use and must only be spent on household members. After shopping, the children will eat lunch, wrap their gifts, and continue to get to know the police officers.

This program originally received Federal Funding which has been cut. Since that time, Shop with Cops has been solely funded through corporate and private funding sources. Target, Walmart and the SPPD Foundation are the major funders for this program. The fiscal agent is the District 8 Planning Council. This year's event will be held on December 4th.

In 2009, the Police Foundation granted this program \$4000.00 and we are requesting \$6000.00 this year to facilitate the high numbers of our local youth who participate in this program. To illustrate the success of this program we took a look at how many youth were served in recent years. In 2007, 82 children participated and in 2009, that number has increased to 232 children.
