As owner or person(s) responsible for : 31 KIPLING ST you are hereby ordered to eliminate all nuisance conditions which are in violation of Chapter 45 of Saint Paul Legislative Code.

- 1. Remove improperly stored or accumulated refuse including: garbage, rubbish, loose and scattered litter, discarded furniture, appliances, vehicle parts, scrap wood and metal, recycling materials, household items, building materials or rubble, tires, brush, etc., from yard areas. INCLUDING REMOVE ALL FIRE DAMAGED ITEMS. WOOD METAL TIRES, RUBBISH THROUGHOUT REAR YARD. CLEAR OUT REAR YARD. Comply before August 22, 2016**

If you do not correct the nuisance or file an appeal before August 22, 2016 , the City will correct the nuisance and charge all costs, including boarding costs, against the property as a special assessment to be collected in the same way as property taxes.

Charges: If the City corrects the nuisance, the charges will include the cost of correction, inspection, travel time, equipments, etc. The rate will be approximately \$260 per hour plus expensed for abatement.

You must submit a copy of this Summary Abatement Notice with your appeal application.**
