Todd Hurley, Office of Financial Services (OFS), reviewed the results of the bond sale and use of the proceeds. He said the volatility of the market had resulted in low rates and favorable conditions for an additional bond sale in 2011. He noted positive comments the City had received from the rating agencies, and the importance maintaining excellent ratings. He thanked the City Council and acknowledged staff and financial advisors who had worked on the sale.

At Councilmember Harris' request, Mr. Hurley spoke about the large spreads between AA and AAA and how important it was for the City to maintain its rating, particularly at this time. Councilmember Harris said investors were looking for high quality issues, and the budget work the City did resulted in quantifiable savings to the taxpayer. He thanked Mr. Hurley, Bob Geurs, the OFS team and financial advisors for their diligent work.

Councilmember Harris moved the resolution as amended with the results of the sale.

Councilmember Bostrom spoke about the history of the use of the facility, and said it was a worthwhile project and good to get out from under the payments to the County.
