As owner or person(s) responsible for: **969 JUNO AVE** you are hereby ordered to eliminate the snow and/or ice from the public sidewalk abutting this property which are in violation of Chapter 113 and/or Chapter 45 of Saint Paul Legislative Code.

Remove ice/snow from the public sidewalk and salt and sand as needed. **Note: portion of walk in front of 969 Juno has been cleared of loose snow but is compacted. Sand or salt area.**

A reinspection of this sidewalk will be conducted 48 HOURS after the issuance of this notice. If the snow and/or ice remains, the City of Saint Paul will abate this nuisance and charge these costs, including administrative costs, to the property taxes as a special assessment to be collected in the same manner as taxes. **NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ORDER AND REPEAT VIOLATIONS WILL RESULT IN THE ISSUANCE OF A CRIMINAL CITATION.**

CHARGES: If the City corrects the nuisance, the charges will include the cost of correction, inspection, travel time, equipment, etc. The rate will be approximately \$160.00 per hour with a ½ hour minimum plus expenses for abatement.
