The Minnesota Chapter of the Midwest Gang Investigators Association (MGIA) is a 501 C Non-Profit Organization comprised of Law Enforcement, Probation/Parole, & Correctional Officers and Prosecuting Attorneys who specialize in dealing with violent gang crimes. Their 501 C Non-Profit number is 39-1575322. They have the following two primary missions;

First, they put on several conferences annually in the State of Minnesota, at minimal cost, for the purpose of disseminating the most accurate information they have about current trends in criminal gang activity to educate both law enforcement officers and our communities on the most effective ways to suppress it and to intervene & prevent our children from becoming involved in it.

Second, they use the money they make on these conferences to provide scholarships to send as many of our gang investigators & specialists as possible to an Annual National Gang Conference which they are required to attend to establish themselves as gang experts.

Training budgets are tight in these tough economic times and the St. Paul Police Department (SPPD) and MGIA cannot afford to send our officers to this National Conference without assistance.

We have requested to send 5 total SPPD officers from the SPPD Gang Unit and Safe Streets Task Force (SSTF) to the National Gang Conference in Dubuque, Iowa. The SPPD Officers are Commander Paul Iovino and Officers Tony Spencer, Tim Pinoniemi, Matt St. Sauver, & Armando Abla-Reyes. MGIA is committed to seeing as many officers as possible attend this National Conference.

MN Chapter Vice President Kris Lundquist, has negotiated with the National Conference to give us the \$250 tuition/registration rate for scholarship recipients. Our Officers are willing to room together to cut costs. We are also willing to carpool in a personal vehicle to Dubuque. We are hopeful that we might be able to be reimbursed for gas. It will cost MGIA \$1,250 for tuition, \$806.40 for rooms and we estimate \$200.00 for gas. We estimate an approximate total of \$2,256.40

We are respectfully requesting that the Saint Paul Police Foundation please consider contributing 1/2 of this total (\$1,128.20) to insure that we are able to send all 5 officers to the National Gang Conference in May. MGIA will pay the other half of the costs associated with this training.

Transnational Gangs: Dr. Al Valdez is a nationally recognized trainer and consultant in the areas of youth violence, gang sociology and behaviors, gang investigations and prosecution, parent/teacher awareness issues, prevention/intervention, models, occupational crimes, and officer/supervisor training programs. Presently he is a professor at the University of California-Irvine. He is also a consultant to the California and U.S. Departments of Justice, the military, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and is an instructor for basic police and district attorney academies. He has written over 80 articles and published four books on gang history, customs and practices, and related issues.

Today's Chicago Street Gangs: Detective Dave Fidyk, Detective Louie Wancz and Sgt. Eddie Yoshimura - These three instructors represent over seventy five years of law enforcement experience and all are current Chicago Police Officers.

Dave is currently assigned to the Organized Crime Division, Gang Investigations Section where he currently functions as the Prison Liaison for the Gang Investigations Unit.

Louie has been a Violent Crimes Detective for approximately twenty years and is currently assigned to the Cold Case Unit.

Eddie was promoted to Gang Specialist and assigned to both the Gang Intelligence and Narcotics and Gang Investigations Section. Eddie, now as a Sergeant, supervises a Surveillance Team that is assigned to the Gang Investigations Unit.

Corrections - Probation / Parole: Randy Day & William Sperflage

Randy Day started his career in corrections as a Correctional Officer at the Anamosa State Penitentiary in August of 1980. He was promoted to Sergeant and then to a Correctional Supervisor I in 1997, the Department of Corrections Officer with the 6th Judicial District in 2001, the Iowa Department of Corrections Security Threat Group policy and designing the DOC Security Threat Group database. He is currently a Security Threat Group Intelligence Officer for the 6th Judicial District Dept. of Correctional Services and an advisor to the DOC Security Threat Group Intelligence Officer Steering Committee. His current position is a Parole/Probation Officer III, with the High Risk Unit in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Deputy Warden William Sperflage began his career as a Correctional Officer at the Anamosa State Penitentiary, and has been in the corrections field for over 25 years. Bill has held the positions of Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain and Major. In November of 2000, he became the Deputy Warden of the Iowa State Penitentiary. Bill became involved in gang investigations in 1998. He has been a DOC Intelligence Officer since 1992, and has been a member of the STG Steering Committee since 1994. Bill currently serves as liaison for the DOC Central Office and Intelligence Officers.

GRANT APPLICATION

The Saint Paul Police Mounted Patrol Unit serves as a patrol unit in Citywide Services. The Mounted Patrol supports the regular patrol units in a variety of ways including but not limited to: Crowd Control, backup activities and proactive patrol.

The Mounted Unit is a mobile unit that depends on a truck and trailer to move the horses from one location to another. The horse trailers currently in use are over 10 years old. Despite routine maintenance, the aluminum floors have worn to the point of being unsafe for the transport of the equines. Further, the rubber matting used to support the horses is worn and of little use towards providing support. The lack of matting endangers the horses and contributes to the instability of the trailer load. The trailer will require repairs or replacement. Replacement costs exceed \$30,000.00. Repairs to extend the life of the trailer another 10 years were estimated to be approximately \$2,000.00.

On September 3, 2009, funds in the amount of \$2,000.00 were deposited into the Police Federation from a grant generated by MLR Foundation. The funds were in the form of a check (# 3012) drawn on the Chase Bank, N.A. and were earmarked to provide funds for the Saint Paul Police Mounted Unit.

In June, 2010, the Public Safety Garage repaired the worn floor. The horse trailer was then delivered to Rhino Linings of Red Wing Inc. Rhino Linings applied troweled rubber and sprayed polyurethane to the floor of the trailer to complete the repairs. The total cost of the repairs was \$1,638.00 (payable to Rhino Linings of Red Wing).

We are requesting funds (\$1,638.00) to cover the repair of the horse trailer.
