To Ron Hall:

At its meeting on June 22, 2017, the Ramsey/Washington Recycling & Energy Board (R&E Board) approved a hauler waste delivery agreement for 2018-2022 (five years), and authorized it to be offered to haulers of Ramsey and/or Washington County waste. The same agreement is being offered to all haulers, and the same terms and conditions will apply to all haulers that enter into the agreement. Therefore, the agreement is not negotiable.

Acceptable Waste collected in Ramsey and Washington County by haulers that sign the agreement would not be subject to waste designation, as the agreement requires the hauler to deliver all Ramsey and Washington County Acceptable Waste to either the R&E Center in Newport or to an approved transfer station. Haulers that sign the agreement are eligible for rebates as provided in the agreement and will also be able to use transfer stations under contract to the R&E Board.

Acceptable Waste collected in Ramsey and Washington Counties by haulers that do not sign the agreement will be subject to the waste designation ordinances of each County upon implementation (expected to be effective January 1, 2018), which means those haulers must then deliver Ramsey and Washington County Acceptable Waste directly to the R&E Center and would not be eligible for rebates.

Please find enclosed two copies of the agreement for your consideration. The agreement is also available on the R&E Board website at <http://morevaluelesstrash.com/haulers/>. If you wish to enter into the agreement, have your organization's authorized representative sign and date both copies and return them in the postage-paid envelope provided. We will return a fully executed copy to you.

Please note that the agreement does not take effect until waste designation becomes effective. Also note that updated certificates of insurance (COI), with liability coverages set forth by State law and listed in the agreement, will be required for 2018. The liability coverages required by Statute are different than those needed for the regional hauler licensing program, so please review those. Updated COIs can be submitted separate from the agreement. We will also be contacting haulers that sign the agreement about submitting other necessary forms, including a W-9 form and a SWMT-10 form, prior to the end of this year.
